
OUR DEAN & CREECH RELATIVES

CREECH

This article appeared in The "Louisville Herald" on May 19, 1918.

A short history of a noted man of the Kentucky Mountains.

Uncle William Creech of Harlan County Kentucky affectionately known as "Uncle Billy" was the principal founder of the Pine Mountain Settlement School and a remarkable character whose benificence had great results in the Kentucky Mountains.

His death occurred in a Louisville hospital May 18, 1918 and from there his body was taken to his home in Harlan County Kentucky,

Uncle William was beloved as the founder of the Pine Mountain Settlement School, one of the most important educational institutions to be established in the Eastern Kentucky Mountains. He was a picturesque character in that section of the State where many of the writers won fame with stories from real life.

"Uncle Billy Creech" as he was affectionately known to thousands of men, women, and children throughout the Country and in the mountain sections of the state, came here to Norton Memorial Infirmary at Louisville from his home section in the Pine Mountains where many came to pay him respect, love and devotion.

Several weeks ago he was brought here for treatment. He was suffering from a complication of diseases and when his condition became desperate a surgical operation was decided on as a last resort and the only hope of saving his life. He came out of the ordeal very weak and his death was not unexpected.

He was born in Kentucky in 1845 and after serving throughout the war between the States; he was one of the first pioneers to journey back over the Kentucky Mountains to the head waters of the Kentucky River. There he labored for many years to improve conditions. He inspired all of his neighbors with the art of industry.

Many years ago he began promoting his Settlement School. It was not however until five years ago that he was able to deed all of his property over to the Pine Mountain Settlement to have and to hold for school purposes as long as the Constitution of the United States Stands, according to the text of his written arrangement. The school today is prospering beyond the fondest hopes of "Uncle Billy" and those associated with him,

He had been conspicuous all through his life in his zeal for better things, Writing recently of his hopes for the children in the Pine Mountain School. I don't look after wealth for them, I look to the future of our Country. I want them taught the knowledge of good and evil and to serve the living God,

After the establishment of the Settlement School, Uncle Billy and his faithful followers indefatigably labored to raise funds for the building of a road from one of the isolated sections to the school. This highway, he said, would liberate more than 5,000 people and enable them to reach the education available at the settlement. Success crowned his project and he afterwards said that his life work was finished and he was ready to die happy.

The body of "Uncle Billy" was taken to Pine Mountain late in day after his death.

Besides his widow he is survived by the following children: Joseph G., William R., and Henry Creech and three daughters: Mrs. Polly Lewis, Mrs. Nancy Lewis and Mrs. Rhoda Wilder, all residents of Kentucky.

Ira Paulus Ison

The above article was found among some pages passed down to me from among the papers of Ira Paulus Ison, who was my double first cousin, once removed.

Ira Paulus Ison was himself a well known man of Kentucky. He wrote many articles which were published in Eastern Kentucky newspapers. He was the family historian for the Creech and Ison families and is responsible for most of what I have gathered about these families.

"Ira P", as he was known to my family, was the son of Andrew Jackson Ison and Hannah Creech. Andrew was the brother of my grandfather George Washington Ison, and Hannah was the sister of my grandmother Annie Creech. Thus he was my "double" first cousin once removed.

Through this Web Site and E-mail, I have met his grand daughter Nancy White Davis. We are double second cousins once removed.

The nearly solid rock mound in an old marsh offered a good place to build a defensive tower. Rock gave a solid foundation and marsh slowed the advance of the enemy. In the 8th and 9th centuries viking raiders rowed their longships up the river looking for rich farms to attack. The ridge between the rock mound and the Tay afforded a lookout point little noticed from the river. If the Vikings did stop to attack, there was time to gather goods and people to the rock mound in the middle of the marsh.

The children of Davie Beaton and Lady Margaret Ogilvie were reared in Creich Castle with full knowledge of their ancestry. On their father's side were the Earl MacDuff, Robert the Bruce, Earl MacBeth, Queen Gruoch, the Malcolm Kings, Queen Margaret Althing of Hungarian royalty, English royalty and Thor Finn the Mighty's sister, Queen Ingaborg, first wife of Malcolm Canamore III. On their mother's side their grandfather was Lord Ogilvie Lavi of Angus, descendant of the Pictish kings of Angus. These children knew they were not ordinary landless peasants! They were children of Creich Castle - a royal property for 600 years!

Mary, Queen of Scots, had four ladies in waiting. One was Mary Beaton of Creich. Queen Mary often wrote of the kindness of the Laird of Creich in keeping Castle Falklands with plenty of good food while she lived at Falkland. The town of Creich, Scotland, grew up with Creich parish as a market place for Church.

By the time John knox returned to Scotland preaching Calvinism, the Scottish throne and supporting nobility were corrupt. The nobility was using the Church in a way never seen before in Europe. Church was part and parcel of the scheme to keep control of the people and the nation. Christianity was preached, but not practiced. The Archbishop of St. Andrews, Davie Beaton of Creich Castle, religious primate of Scotland, made an enemy of Henry VIII of England, who wanted his daughter on the throne of Scotland. Beaton supported Mary as queen. No agreement could be reached. King Henry sent a professional assassin to murder Beaton. Learning of the plot, Beaton had the assassin tried and convicted of heresy. He watched from his episcopal window as George Wisehart burned at the stake. The next year a group of Scots nobles crept into Beaton's bedroom and stabbed him to death. They hanged his naked body by the ankle from the same episcopal window for all to see. Any friends or family of Davie Beaton, Archbishop of St. Andrews, were under death threats. The Laird of Creich and his family fled. John Knox preached for their death, and the castle was occupied by his followers and the property converged to his use. Mary, Queen of Scots, was driven from the nation, Creich Castle was no longer a royal property and the official religion became Presbyterian.

To survive they must change their name and renounce their ancestors or keep their family name and leave home. Surely some chose security and renounced their heritage. The defiant ones kept their name and moved to areas where the name Creich was not associated with Archbishop Davie Beaton. Thus did the family name of Creich disappear from Castle Creich after 600 years of living there.

Richard Creich emigrated to Jamestown, Virginia, as a mercenary guard to the English tobacco farmers. Creech is the English spelling. This Richard was killed on the outer perimeter of Jamestown during an attack by indians. His wife and daughter also died, but his two sons away at school at the time survived to become ancestors of the Family Creich in the colonies.







Grandpa said his school teachers were W.H.H.Carpenter, Steve Cheech, Enoch Blair, Boone Bailey, Ren Kelley,

Jim Farsons and Anna Williver.

He said he went to school for three months each year, in a little twenty foot scuare log house.

The furniture in their home was hand made, they slept on a feather and shuck (corn) bed. They used pineknots for a light. Then there was the little brash light and

then came the wicks which was the first lamps. He said it was sixty miles to the closest railroad and store. That every thing had to be hauled in on a vagon. He remembered they cooked on a fireplace. For washing their clothes they went to the creek and used a paddle to bent the dirt out of them. Then there were the rail fences which were everywhere. The Circuit Rider came. This was America not too rany years back. Families lived close together. They lived close to the earth. The land fed them, then their own timber was used to make their coffin the children buried the parents then the childrens, childrens buried them mostly in a family cemetary. They all lived close together not like today where families are scattered all across the country. The old Creech home place in Elliott County, Kentucky is owned by his son Arthur Creech who still farms it. It has changed since grandma and grandpa lived there but then it had to be because they are gone now and the family is scattered over many miles and they donot go back for the family get togethers they used to have those many years ago. Cnly memories linger now of the times that used to be. The reason for this little book is to preserve some of those things we would like to keep in our memory. Such as the house, fireplace, well, barn, garden, strawberry ratch, the gingerbread cookies, grandma and grandpa walking for

HARVE DEAN was the son of Patton Dean and Mary J. Dean, who was the son of James H. and Nancy Fields Dean. He was born in Carter County, Kentucky in 1878. He married Zoan Thomas who was the daughter of Jim Ambers Thomas and Nancy Mocabee Thomas. Harve & Zoan's children were infant dead (Buford), Russell Dean, Bert Dean, Paul Dean, John R. Dean, Celle Dean, Nell Dean (Puckett), Bess Dean (Conley), Dess Dean (Kegley), Irene Dean (Jones), Lucille Dean (Jones). HARVE & ZOAN moved from Mocabee Creek, Carter County around 1913 to Hays Branch, Kentucky. Zoan passed away in 1942 and Harve in 1949.

HARVE worked at the Hayward Brickyard in Carter County, worked on the C & O Railroad, operated a blacksmith shop, was a farmer, trader, worked for a while in 1900-1903 in Antioch, Wisconsin. He also made cross ties for the railroad.

HARVE and wife Zoan were registered republicans. Zoan's funeral was conducted at the Hays Crossing Nazarene Church in 1942. Walter Williams of Olive Hill, Kentucky conducted the funeral.

HARVE'S funeral was conducted at the home of his sister Nan Dean Mabry and was buried beside his wife in the Mabry Cemetery at Hays Branch, KY.

HARVE'S wife Zoan Thomas (Dean) was a housewife, gardener, seamstress, and canned many hundreds quarts of fruits and vegetables over the years. They raised practically everything they needed for their family.



We are writing you concerning the 10th Annual Dean and Creech Reunion to be held September 2, 1984 at the Carl Perkins Building in Morehead, Kentucky beginning at 11 a.m.

We hope all roads lead to Morehead for this reunion. Your ancestors lived here, walked on this soil, built roads, homes, inventions, and contributed to the advancement of this nation.

I REMEMBER MA DEAN

Zoan Thomas Dean was born in 1879 to Jim Ambers Thomas and Nancy Mocabee Thomas--I called her Ma because that is what my dad called her. She and pap moved to Hays Branch around 1913 from Carter County. She was an industrious person who knew what hard times were. She wasn't afraid of hard work and provided well for her household. She took pride in her garden and would can and preserve what she could for the winter months. The home was furnished with simple furniture but she kept it neat and clean as possible. I remember helping her set out a cedar tree in the yard when I was about nine years old. I remember she would pick gooseberries, pie plant, and gather what apples that grew on the trees. It was over a wood stove in the kitchen that she cooked the daily meals. I enjoyed eating with Ma and Pap. The wood box sat on the back porch and if no one was around she would fill it herself. I enjoyed helping gather the duck eggs and carrying them in. Once in a while my brother, Vernon and I would stay all night with her and Pap. We got to sleep upstairs on the featherbed where it was warm. She would pick the ducks for the feathers to use in pillows and featherbed. Even the day before her death, my dad, brother and I visited her. I remember she encouraged us to do good in school. December 21, 1941 at approximately 6:30 a.m. she passed away. I remember my dad was milking and Brian Brown who stayed with them brought us the news. Brian stayed with my brother and I, and Mom and Dad went down to the house immediately. There was a deep snow on at this time of year. Ma will always be remembered in the hearts of those who knew her.

Creech died Sunday morning in Harlan Hospital. He was a member of the Baileys Creek Methodist Church. He was an active church worker and took a great interest in the development: of schools in the county. He served as magistrate of his district one term.

Born At Closplint

He was born at Closplint, near the head of Clover Fork, and grew to manhood there. In 1882 he married Elizabeth Kelly. The couple established a home on Clover Gap branch where they farmed for a while.

They later moved near High Splint where Creech purchased a tract of land. In 1891 he bought the James Turner farm about a mile and half above Evarts on Clover Fork and established his home and lived for the last 62 years.

The tract of land comprised about 900 acres. He farmed about 100 acres of it and sold logs from other 800 acres of timber land.

He was actively engaged in the logging business for about 30 years. He farmed in the summer and opring and logged during the b. winter months.

DEAN AND CREECH REUNION was held on September 2, 1979 at the Rowan Co. High School cafeteria in Morehead, Ky. beginning at 10:00 a. m. The following story is furnished by The Rowan County Historical Society at Morehead, Kentucky 40351:

HARVE DEAN was the son of Patton Dean and Mary J. Dean, who was the son of James H. and Nancy Fields Dean. He was born in Carter Co., Ky. in 1878. He married Zoan Thomas who was the daughter of Jim Ambers Thomas and Nancy Mocabec Thomas. Harve & Zoan's children were infant dead (Buford), Russell Dean, Bert Dean, Paul Dean, John R. Dean, Celle Dean, Nell Dean (Puckett), Bess Dean (Conley), Dess Dean (Kegley), Irene Dean (Jones), Lucille Dean (Jones). Harve and Zoan moved from Mocabee Creek, Carter Co. around 1913 to Hays Branch, Ky. Zoan passed away in 1942 and Harve in 1949.

Harve worked at the Hayward Brickyard in Carter Co., worked on the C &~0Railroad, operated a blacksmith snop, was a farmer, trader, worked for a while in 1900-1903 in Antioch, Wisconsin. He also made cross ties for the railroad.

llarve and wife Zoan were registered republicans. Zoan's funeral was conducted at the Hays Crossing Nazarene Church in 1942. Walter Williams of Olive Hill, Ky. conducted the funeral.

Harve's funeral was conducted at the home of his sister Nan Dean Mabry and was buried beside his wife in the Mabry Cemetery at Hays Branch, Ky.

Harve's wife Zoan Thomas Dean was a housewife, gardener, seamstress, and canned many hundreds of quarts of fruits and vegetables over the years. They raised practically everything they needed for their family.

THE LINDER FAMILY ASSOCIATION recently held its 5th national convention with 17 states represented. Founded in 1966, the files now contain over 500 group sheets and nearly 2000 index cards in addition to copies of wills, military records, deeds and other instruments of documentation on various Linder lineages.

The majority of Linders represented in the association are descendants of 2 or 3 Linders who came to America in the mid-1700's. One family settled in the Shenandoah Valley with shoots into Pennsylvania, Ohio and Indiana; another segment migrating through Kentucky (where they lived close to the Lincolns) into Missouri, Kansas and the Mid-West; and a third element expanding across the Carolinas and into the Deep South states of Mississippi and Alabama. Ludwig Linder landed in Charleston, S. C. in 1735: his family was prominent in that area, in southern Alabama and down into southeastern Texas. Several Linder lines begin in Tennessee; several of 19th century arrival have many descendants in the strip from Pennsylvania across the northwest to Illinois. Research is now underway in Germany to link these Linder families in their fatherland.

In addition to the documented files on Linder and allied lines, the Association has photographs, letterhead and other personal-pride items with the Linder coat of arms. There are 5 Linder coats of arms in Rietstapp's Armorial - from Bavaria, Switzerland, France and Finland. History points out that all these nationalities probably originated in the Scandanavian county - "linder--is an old Nordic word.





Dedication

I spoke or wrote to many people in doing the research for the Creech family history, and to all of them I am most grateful. One person, however, really stands out, partly because of his material assistance but more so because of his enthusiasm and moral support for the project. That person is Forrest Creech.

Forrest was one of the first people I talked to about my idea to trace the descendants of Elijah Creech, and although in poor health at the time, he strongly encouraged me in the project and shared my enthusiasm for it. Over about a year and a half, we traded lots of information as well as many family photographs, and although we never met, that shared enthusiasm made us friends.

It is my great regret that Forrest did not live to see his contributions bear fruit in the completion of this project. Following an extended illness, he died on 28 May 1991, just one month after the 150th anniversary of his great-grandfather's birthdate.

It seems most fitting to dedicate this work to Forrest Creech, a man who exemplified the kind of fascination and pride in one's family history that keeps the researcher "digging" for more and more names and facts. It was the enthusiasm of Forrest, and a handfull of others, that kept me going on this project when I sometimes got discouraged and overwhelmed by it.

The family heritage that so interested Forrest speaks to all of us in subtle but meaningful ways. We are all enriched in one way or another by those who came before us, not because our ancestors were great or important people but because each, in his or her small but unique way, is a part of the great march of human history. In fact it could be said that genealogy is the history of the common man. This work, to which Forrest contributed in no small way, represents a small but personally meaningful piece of that history.

To Forrest Creech then. May his spirit live on in you and me, his family.

(At my request Forrest's widow, Carrie Centers Creech, wrote and submitted the following biography of Forrest).

Biography

Forrest was born on September 24, 1921 near Stanton, Kentucky. His parents were Liberty Creech and Pearl Miller, both of the Wolfe County area near Campton, Kentucky. Forrest attended various elementary schools in nearby communities and upon completion of his education, he began work with his father.

Forrest worked in various professions including occupations such as farmer, oil well driller, carpenter, heavy equipment operator, and in the spring of 1970 retired as a munitions inspector from Jefferson Proving Ground, Madison, Indiana.

Forrest married Carrie Frances Centers September 5, 1941 and he entered the Army in October, 1942. In January 1946, Forrest returned from the Pacific to the state of Washington and wired home for transportation money.

Forrest and Carrie set up housekeeping near Slade, Kentucky which became a part of the Natural Bridge State Park. In December, 1946 their first son Ronald David was born. A second son, Billy Ray was born in June, 1948. Shortly after the birth of their daughter, Judy Carol in June, 1949, the family purchased and moved to a farm near Dupont, Indiana, where they resided until the early 1950's.

In the early 1950's, Forrest moved his family to Rural Route 1, Deputy, Indiana and remained at that location.

Forrest acquired disabling asthma in the late 1960's and was forced to retire early in 1970. Asthma and other associated health problems took his life May 28, 1991.

THE CREECH FAMILY

The name CREECH is Scottish in origin, and has variously been spelled CRITCH, SCRITCH, and CREICH. The family apparently was a sept of the Clan MacDuff, and came from the region of Fife in Scotland.

One of the most notable persons to bear the CREECH name was Willie Creech, editor and printer of the poems of Robert Burns, the famous 18th century Poet-Laureate of Scotland. One of Burns' poems was even dedicated to his editor, and was entitled "An Ode to Willie Creech".

One of the earliest Creechs to come to America was Richard Creech, great-great-great-great-great-great grandfather of our Elijah Creech. He was born in Scotland in 1608 and arrived in James City County, Virginia with his wife Frances Beale Creech in 1635. Nothing else is known about his life, except that he and his wife are presumed to have been killed by Indians, and survived only by his sons Henry (ancester to Elijah Creech) and Nicholas.

The ancestry of Elijah Creech is shown in the form of pedigree charts on the next two pages. Most of this ancestry information is from *Creech Lineage*, by Lillian Broughton Creech.

THE DESCENDANTS OF ELLJAH CREECH

Introduction

In the following history, the descendants of Elijah Creech are listed by generation, starting with Elijah himself, and continuing down to the present time. Elijah Creech and his wives are listed as the "First Generation", his children's families are listed as the "Second Generation", and so forth. Each generation has a different paper color and "header".

Each individual has a unique number by which he/she can be traced from one generation to the next. For example, if you look at the first generation, you will find Elijah listed with all his children. If you want to see the family of Elijah's son Jonathan (number 3), go to the second generation and find number 3. There you will find Jonathan listed again, along with his children. If you then want to see the family of Jonathan's child Savannah (number 34), go to the third generation and look up number 34. There you will find information on her family, and so on. Where there are gaps between numbers, no information was found on those families. Photographs for each family are found after the information for that family. The photo description beneath each photo also contains the unique numbers assigned to the people shown.

FIRST GENERATION

Elijah CREECH b. 23 April 1841 in Lee County, Virginia d. 28 January 1926, on Morris Creek, Powell County, Kentucky.
 M. (1st) 1859 to Nancy COLDIRON b. 6 January 1842 d. 6 June 1890.

Elijah Creech was the son of Mortimore and Elizabeth Shepherd Creech, and the grandson of Jonathan Creech, a wealthy landowner in Lee County, Virginia. In the early 1850's Mortimore married a second time, apparently after his first wife died, and moved to Madison County, Arkansas, where he raised a second family. His son Elijah was left behind in Virginia to live with relatives.

About 1859, Elijah married Nancy Coldiron and moved to eastern Kentucky. Initially, he apparently did not bring Nancy, but came with a friend Jasper Campbell (whose daughter later was to become his second wife). Elijah and Jasper walked (barefoot according to one source) all the way from Virginia into Kentucky across Big Black Mountain, with their belongings on their back.

In 1860, he was living in Powell County, in the home of a man named Green A. Welch, along with the Welch family and Nancy's two brothers Isaac and Riley Coldiron. At this time, he was working as a laborer, and Nancy was probably still in Virginia.

Elijah was a farmer and laborer all his life, and raised a large family. Although soft-spoken he was a stern father and never "spared the rod" when necessary. He was a large man, about 6' 3" tall, weighed 185 pounds, and wore size 11 shoes. He had a large frame with very large wrists (Nancy, by contrast, was only 5' 2" tall, weighed 93 pounds, and wore a size 3 shoe). According to one source, he had a ruddy complexion and a prominant Adam's Apple,

although only one photograph of him is known to exist. One of his grandchildren said that he had unusually long arms, extending to below his knees when he stood up.

Everyone agrees that he was incredibly strong. My grandfather says that Elijah could lie down on the ground and let any two men get holds on him. Then he would easily stand up, dragging both of them with him. According to his son Alf, one time a group of men were trying to catch a 3-year old steer to dehorn him. The steer weighed about 1200 lbs. and they weren't able to subdue him. Finally "Lige" ran out, grabbed the steer by the hind legs and threw him down.

The late 1800's in eastern Kentucky were rough times, and men often settled differences with their fists. A story is told about a prominant citizen in Hazel Green who held a county fair every year. The man was also a heavy drinker. When Lige's daughter Rausaline was a little girl (probably about 1870), she and her daddy were heading up town to the fair, when this man came out into the street wearing nothing but a shirt. When Lige and little Rausaline got close to the man, he pulled the shirt up over his head to hide his face. Lige, apparently embarrassed for his daughter and indignant at the man's behavior, hauled off and hit him so hard that they picked the man up on the other side of the street. Then, Lige and little Rausaline proceeded down the street without saying a word.

During the Civil War, he was a Confederate sniper, sitting in trees while picking off "Yankees". His daughter Rausaline (my great-grandmother) was always a little ashamed of this, thinking that he should have fought out in the open.

In 1875, Elijah bought 56-3/4 acres of land from A. C. Byrd and Lucinda Byrd for the sum of 330 dollars. The transcript of the land deal is as follows:

"This _____, made this 8th day of December, 1875, between A. C. Byrd and Lucinda Byrd of Wolfe County of the the first part and Elijah Creech of the same county and state of the second part witnesseth that the parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of three hundred and thirty dollars in hand paid hath bargained and call and by these precincts doth convey and confirm unto the party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of land, lying in the county of Wolfe and state aforesaid being a tract of the same land deeded by G. W. Cox Master Commissioner of the Wolfe County Circuit Court being a part of the tract of land ____ and ___ as the land of Wm O'hair's heirs and bounded as follows towit. Beginning at a double white oak below the _____ of the branch above the house where Leander Peck now lives, thence due east 27 __ to a white oak Henry Barker's corner thence with the division line between Fulks and Barker N30W 20 ____ to a white oak near the branch thence N24E 38 ____ to a dogwood S80E 10 ______ to _____ on a point N47E 50 _____ to two chestnuts and a chestnut oak on a ridge thence leaving Barker's line N34W 50 to a white oak Clark's corner N34W 27 _____ to a chestnut oak S48W 50 ____ chestnut oak S85W 42 ____ to a chestnut oakS40W 34 ___ to a stake S15E 8 to two small hickories S14E 48 ____ to a hickory S55E 32 ____ to the beginning containing 56 3/4 acres by survey. To have and to hold said property with its appertances thereunto belonging unto the said grantee his heirs and assigns forever and the said party of the first part doth further covenant with the said party of the second part that they will warrant generally the title to the property hereby convey? so far as the parties of the first and their heirs are concerned in testimony whereof the parties of the first part hath hereunto subscribed their names the day and year aforesaid".

A. C. Byrd Lucinda Byrd

Nancy was only 48 years old when she died in 1890. Elijah married a second time, in 1894, to Angeline Campbell Shoemaker, daughter of Elijah's friend Jasper Campbell. Although no photos exist of Angeline, one source says she was very beautiful, with long black hair down to her waist. She also apparently was a very kind person. Her first husband, Mr. Shoemaker had been killed in a sawmill accident.

In 1900, Elijah lived with Angeline, the first two children by her (Alva and Dora), a child Eliza (by his first wife), Eveline Long (also a daughter by his first wife) and Eveline's son Clyde, as well as William R. Shoemaker, a son of Angeline's by her first husband. At this point the family lived in Laurel in a two-room log house Elijah had built, and in which all three of his children by Angeline were born. Dan Center, a grandson, remembers that his grandpa Creech had a big chestnut orchard and that he used to go over there and gather bushels of chestnuts. Lige also raised and sold cattle.

In 1904 Elijah entered into a lease agreement with the New Domain Oil and Gas Company which allowed them to drill for oil and gas on his property, in exchange for a portion of the income from this venture. It is not clear whether any oil or gas was ever found, however.

In about 1914 or 1915, Elijah sold the house on Laurel and moved to near Hazel Green, where he built a house near Boone and Polly Creech Center in an area called the "Public Square". By this time, Alva and Dora had already left home.

After Angeline died, Elijah and his son Jasper moved in with Don Creech, who was living on Laurel Hill, off hwy 191 at that time. They were living here in 1920. In about 1925, Don moved to Paint Creek near Stanton in Powell County, and Elijah and Jasper moved with him. Shortly after, Jasper went into the oil fields where he worked for nine years.

Oma Creech Childers, Don's daughter, remembers her grandfather Elijah well. She says he was a nice man and good to help out around the house. On the morning of January 28, 1926, Oma was fixing breakfast. She said "Grandpa, breakfast is ready." He replied that he was not feeling well. Dr. Marion Center and his wife Rausaline Creech Center came over, and Dr. Center gave him a shot, but that night he died. He was 85.

Jonathan Creech started out as a tenant farmer. He farmed until all his children were born, then went into the oil fields where he worked for over 20 years. His boss was a man named Henry Lane, who began to call him "Don" for some unknown reason. The name stuck with him, and he was called Don from then on. When Henry quit, Don became the boss.

While he was in the oil fields, Don began preaching and continued in this for the rest of his life. After leaving the oil fields, he moved to Stanton in Powell County and converted a barn into the Baptist church, where he preached for many years. One day some one let the heater get too hot, and the church burned to the ground. Later, it was rebuilt.

As long as Don Creech lived, the Creechs had an interesting family custom. If a family member died, they were buried the next day. Then, they has a memorial service on the fourth Sunday in August every year for all family members who had died that year.

Don is remembered by all who knew him as a very nice and warm person.



One of the most powerful cultural forces shaping America, they've produced great Presidents, soldiers, inventors, actors and writers. But, as a group, they've remained invisible. The time has come to change that, says the author.

Going South on I-81, the mountains are beautiful-smoky from the haze that the sun makes when it burns into the pine. You may see cars and Burger Kings on that highway, but I am watching my own ghosts: tough, resilient women on buckboard wagons, hard men with rifles walking alongside,

and kids tending cattle as they make their way down the mud trail called The Wilderness Road.

It is here in the Appalachian Mountains that my people, the Scots-Irish, settled after leaving Ireland and the north of Britain in the 18th century. They tamed the wilderness, building simple log cabins and scraping corn patches in thin soil. And they pressed onward, creating a way of life that many would come to call, if not American, certainly the defining fabric of the South and the Midwest, as well as the core character of the nation's working class.

I am determined to reclaim the dignity of these people - for themselves and for America. It's long overdue.

Off the highway in Virginia, I follow narrow winding roads past small frame houses, finally stopping at the entrance to Alley Hollow. My great-great-grandparents are buried back here, in a rough parch of woods on top of a nearby mountain.

Like many others, these ancestors have only rocks for headstones. I worry that, when my generation dies, their heritage will be lost just as completely - buried under the avalanche of stories that have on occasion ridiculed my people and trivialized their journey.

They came with nothing, and, for a complicated set of reasons, many of them still have nothing. Slurs stick to me, standing on these graves.

These people are too often misconstrued and ignored when America's history is told. They did great things. And, in truth, the Scots-Irish (sometimes also called the ScotchIrish) are a force that still shapes our culture.

Their Gifts To America

The Scots-Irish brought with them a strong, bottom-up individualism, largely inventing America's unique populist-style democracy. They gave us at least a dozen Presidents, beginning with Andrew Jackson and including Chester A. Arthur, Ulysses S. Grant, Theodore Roosevelt (through his mother), Woodrow Wilson, Ronald Reagan (again, through his mother) and, most recently, Bill Clinton.

Their unique soldierly traditions formed the backbone of the country's military, particularly in the Army and Marine Corps. In the Civil War, they formed the bulk of the Confederate Army and a good part of the Union Army as well, and in later wars they provided many of our greatest generals and soldiers.

Stonewall Jackson comes to mind, as do Grant, George S. Patton, and a slew of Army chiefs of staff and Marine Corps commandants. Not to mention Sgt. Alvin York, the hero of World War I; Audie Murphy, the most

decorated soldier of World War II; and David Hackworth, one of America's most decorated veterans of Korea and Vietnam.

The intense competitiveness that makes them good soldiers also has produced a legion of memorable athletes, business leaders and even such completely American pastimes as NASCAR racing, which evolved, from the exploits of the daring moonshine runners of the Appalachian Mountains during Prohibition.

They created and still dominate country music - which, along with jazz and soul, is one of the truly American musical forms. They gave us so many brilliant writers - Mark Twain the lion among them, Howrace Greeley, Edgar Allan Poe and Margaret Mitchell not far behind, and Larry McMurtry a good honorable mention - that their style of folklore became one of the truest American art forms. And they brought us a horde of thespians, including Tallulah Bankhead, Ava Gardner, Jimmy Stewart, John Wayne, Robert Redford and George C. Scott.

A Culture of Contrasts

The traditional Scots-Irish culture, like America itself, is a study in wild contrasts. These are an intensely religious people - indeed, they comprise the very heart of the Christian evangelical movement - and yet they are also unapologetically and even devilishly hedonistic.

They are probably the most anti-authoritarian culture in America, conditioned from birth to resist. (It is interesting that Rosa Parks, whose refusal to move to the back of the bus sparked the modern Civil Rights movement, speaks of her Scots-Irish great-grandfather.) And yet they are known as the most intensely patriotic segment of the country as well.

They are naturally rebellious, often impossible to control, and yet their strong military tradition produces generation after generation of perhaps the finest soldiers the world has ever seen.

They are filled with wanderlust, but no matter how far they roam, their passion for family travels with them. Underlying these seeming contradictions is a strong unwritten code of personal honor and individual accountability.

Rednecks

Because "sophisticated" America tends to avert its eyes from them, it is inclined to ignore or misunderstand this culture. The Scots-Irish tradition of disregarding formal education and mistrusting, even despising, any form of aristocracy has given us the man the elites love to hate - the unreconstructed redneck. The Southern redneck is an easy target, with his intrinsic stubbornness, his capacity for violence and his curious social ways.

His legacy is stained because he became the dominant culture in the South, whose economic system was based on slavery. No matter that the English aristocrats of Tidewater were slavery's originators and principal beneficiaries or that the typical Scots-Irish yeoman had no slaves.

His is a culture founded on guns. He considers the Second Amendment sacrosanct. Literary and academic America sees such views as not only archaic but also threatening.

The things he's known for aren't exactly valued in America's centers of power. He's always been a loyal American, sometimes to the point of mawkishness. He shows up for our wars. He hauls our goods, grows our food, sweats in our factories.

In the classic film Cool Hand Luke, the warden of a Southern work camp was fond of saying to the irascible title character, "Luke, we got to get your mind right." But the warden never got Luke's mind right. He put Luke in solitary. He put him in chains to keep him from running But Luke kept running, kept resisting, because he would rather die than have the warden make his mind right.

Luke was nothing more than an unpretentious, unreconstructed, unre-educated redneck. And America is a much stronger country for all his stubbornness, his willingness to stay true to himself and his refusal to back down in the face of pressure from above.

A Time for Rediscovery

The Scots-Irish are a fiercely independent, individualist people. It goes against their grain to think collectively. But, as America rushes forward into yet another redefinition of itself, the contributions of the Scots-Irish are too great to remain invisible. My culture needs to reclaim itself - stop letting others define, mock and even use it - and in so doing regain its power to shape the direction of America.

Eecause our country needs us.

We are the molten core at the very center of its unbridled, raw, rebellious spirit. We helped build this nation from the bottom up. We face the world on our feet and not on our knees. We were born fighting. And if the cause is right, we will never retreat.

Who Are The Scots-Irish?

n the decades leading up to the American Revolution, as many as 400,000 immigrants left Ireland, Scotland and northern England for America. While some were Irish and some English, the majority were Scottish Protestants, mostly from Northern Ireland, where they had grown weary of the conflict between the Anglican English and Irish Catholics.

Variously known as the Ulster Scots, the Scots-Irish and the Scotch-Irish, they traveled in family groups rather than as individuals and settled together on America's frontiers, where, because of interlocking family networks, their folkways became dominant. One group settled in New Hampshire, spreading out into Vermont and Maine, but the overwhelming majority—more than 95 percent—settled along the Appalachian Mountains from Pennsylvania down to north Georgia and Alabama.

From there they migrated westward, forming the backbone of the rural South and Midwest, and then into settlements in Texas, Colorado and the Pacific Coast. They also moved north into the industrial areas of Michigan, Illinois, Ohio and Indiana.

It is estimated that there are more than 27 million descendants of the Scots-Irish migration now living in the U.S. Because people from this culture also identify themselves as of Scottish, English or Irish descent, the actual number is probably much higher.

Which states have the highest Scots-Irish populations?
Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, northern Florida, Mississippi, Arkansas, northern Louisiana, Missouri, Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado, southern Ohio, Illinois, Indiana and parts of California, particularly around Bakersfield. The north-central "factory belt," especially around Detroit, also saw a heavily Scots-Irish influx.



Dean researches family tree, Haldeman, Pentecostal history

MOREHEAD — Lloyd Dean's genealogical hunt began on Thanksgiving Day 1959, when he was visiting his uncle and aunt in Hillsboro, Ohio.

Dean said that while the family was watching Danny Thomas on TV, his aunt remembered that their grandmother was a Thomas. "Where did we all come from?" Dean said they began asking.

He was soon to find out, through many hours spent and miles traveled researching records in courthouses and newspapers. Dean's research resulted in his publishing a book on the Creech and Wynn

family tree in 1964.

Dean, pastor of Morehead United Pentecostal Church, said there is "200 years of information" in the small book, which was reprinted in 1995. He has since published several other volumes about the Dean,

Creech and Wynn families based on his genealogical research.

Dean, 65, has reviewed courthouse records such as marriage licenses and deeds, and newspaper articles in his research of his family tree. He also visited the genealogical records compiled by the Latter Day Saints church, while at a ministers' convention held in Salt Lake City.

But Dean said he gets the most information from obituaries, which "tell you more than anything" in tracking down genealogical lines. He has also received letters from around the country, in response to his published requests for information.

Family Bibles and census records are also a good sources of information, he said. The reunion of the Dean and Creech families is held every Labor Day weekend.

Dean also has researched the Haldeman area of Rowan County, and the Pentecostal movement in Kentucky.

He grew up in the Haldeman area, and first wrote a history of (Continued on page A-7)

the area as a class assignment while attending the University of Kentucky in 1951. "I was interested in Haldeman," he said, having grown up in nearby Hayes Crossing and attended Haldeman High School.

His research on Haldeman turned up a trove of information. Dean said the area at one time had two brickyards and mines. Haldeman also had "one of the first rural basketball teams in Kentucky, one of the top in eastern Kentucky," as well as "one of the few indoor gyms" at one time.

He added that local businessman L.P. Haldeman collected \$1 a month to contribute to an athletic fund for the high school team. Dean said the brickyard fielded an all-star team. The brickyard closed in 1950, and stood for several years before being torn down.

Dean started the Haldeman reunion in 1980, which met at the old high school until 1993, when the county school district sold the building. The Haldeman Alumni Association disbanded soon afterward. "We don't have anywhere to hold a reunion.

Dean is currently working on a book about Kentucky's Pentecostal history. Dean is part of this history himself, having started Morehead's United Pentecostal Church on March 1, 1959, while a senior at Morehead State.

The church met in two different buildings before moving to its Tolliver Street church building in 1969. Dean was also the founder and editor of the

denomination's Kentucky newsletter from 1957 to 1969.

Dean became a minister while stationed in the Air Force in California in 1955. He also served in the Air Force during the Korean War.

The information for his book on Pentecostal history started with distributing a questionnaire he wrote up in 1957. He also gathered information from church conferences and other sources. The histories of deceased ministers has been one major area of this research.

Dean is married to the former Arvetta Planck, 63.
