had not joined another church.

July 1, 1815 was the day on which Thomas Easterling died.
(There is no record of his having returned to the church.)

Rebecca Easterling (must be Thomas' wife) received by
experience June 19, 1824.

Rebecca Easterling died Nov. 22, 1842

Southwest Virginia, which data you may already have, I will include it here for

~~RESEARCH ON THE ELAM & EASTERLING FAMILIES~~

SWEN'S INDEX of the names and places, in Virginia history, contains the best
references to Virginia families of any volume that I know about. Dr. Swen published
two large volumes using the leading historical magazines and publications of the
State of Virginia, and his index is as near complete as any public record in the
nation. The two volumes do not contain a reference to the name EASTERLING, and I
am assuming that this family went into Southwest Virginia, from North Carolina,
where we do find early records. I shall search the N.C. Archives in Raleigh for
data on the names in which you are interested, such as the Elams, and others.

The data in this present report is from only two counties in Virginia, Russell
and Washington, both of which were searched. On account of previous obligations
in North Carolina, I did not have time to finish the work in those two counties and
did not get into Scott County. A later trip will have to be made and I will combine
this with other jobs and hold down my own expenses, as well as save time for my
clients.

I found no EASTERLING records in Washington County, Virginia, and what I found
were in Russell County. I read these carefully to ascertain whether or not they held
information that might be needed by you, or pertinent to your case. I will give
the data in numbered ITEMS, to which easy reference may be made when needed.

RUSSELL COUNTY, VA., RECORDS.

1. Deed Book 3, p-29, 11-13-1798.

Joseph Baines & wife Anna, convey to THOMAS
EASTERLING, of Russell County, for 10 lbs., 65 acres on Copper Creek, of
Clinch River.

(COMMENT BY WDK). Copper Creek flows S-Westerly into Clinch River and runs
through both Russell & Scott Counties. This is the earliest land conveyed
to said Easterling in this area.

2. Deed Book 3, p-527, 8-14-1804.
Joseph Whitley, Jr., conveys to THOMAS EASTERLING, all Russell County, for 65 lbs. 120 acres on So/Side of Clinch River; granted to Thos. Blackman, Jr., and on So/Side of Copper Creek, adjoining Jos. Whitley and Wm. Whitley.
(COMMENT WDK). This makes 185 acres of adjoining land to Easterling
3. Deed Book 4, p-84, 8-25-1806.
Josiah Sallyer & wf Mary, of Knox County, Ky., to THOMAS EASTERLING, of Russell Co., Va., 100 acres on both sides of Copper Creek, beginning on Moll's Creek, etc., a North Branch of Copper Creek.
Witnesses: James Ramey, Joshua Peneck, Joshua Stapleton.
4. Deed Book 4, page 120, 10-5-1807.
Thomas Easterling & wife Rebecca, sell to John Carter, all Russell County, 120 acres on So/Side of Clinch River. (WDK) This is the same land as found in ITEM # 2.
5. Deed Book 5, p-141, 10-25-1814.
Thomas Easterling buys tract on West Sinking Creek, being part of 76,593 acres. Russell County.
6. Deed Book 6, p-22, 8-13-1817.
Reuben Warren & wf Sarah, to JOHN EASTERLING, of Scott County, for \$176.00, 30 acres adjoining WALTER ELAMS, Rght. Newberry; (WDK) This is sold in the following ITEM. (Land in Russell County).
7. Deed Book 10, p-384, 11-5-1838.
John Easterling & wf Sarah, of Scott County, to Nimrod Elam of Russell County, for \$200.00, 30 acres adjoining Walter Elam, in Russell County.
8. Deed Book 11, p-376, 10-29-1839.
WILLIAM ELAM, of Morgan County, Ky., to Nimrod Elam of Russell County, Va., for \$250.00, 20 acres on Grassy Creek.
Witnesses: Absalom Elam, and others.
9. Deed Book 11, p-423, 11-2-1844.
Nimrod Elam & wf Mary, of Russell County, Va., to Peter Hartsock, of Scott County, Va., 81 acres, both sides of Grassy Creek, being land conveyed by WILLIAM ELAM to Nimrod Elam, 81 acres.
10. Deed Book 12, p-343, 9-29-1849.
James Easterling & wf Elizabeth, of Scott Co., Va., to WILLIAM ELAM of Russell County, for \$350.00, part of 100 acre tract on Copper Creek, the same tract that said James purchased from THOMAS EASTERLING, deceased.

11. Deed Book 13, p-464, 11-28-1854.

Henry Easterling & wf, Katharine, to John Dickenson, 40 acres on So/Side of Grassy Creek.

12. Deed Book 23, p-213, 10-13-1866.

Aaron Burton, Atty. for WM. EASTERLING, of Carter County, Ky., conveys to Jexima Vicars, of Russell County, Va., for \$100, all his interest in lands conveyed to him by REBECCA EASTERLING, deceased.

(COMMENT BY WDK). This establishes the fact that above William Easterling moved to Carter County, Ky., and that he was son of Rebecca Easterling, widow most likely of Thomas Easterling. She evidently lived to a ripe old age.

Above deed goes on to say: "The land that was coming to her from Paul Vicars, deceased, on the waters of Maul's (Moll's) Creek." See ITEM # 3, 1806. This indicates that she was a daughter of said Paul Vicars. I was unable to locate a marriage record, however, in Washington or Russell Counties.

13. Deed Book 11, p-503, 8-2-1845. (Also from your records. Entered here for easy reference, and in brief form).

(WDK) ITEM # 2, shows that the Whitleys had adjoining land to Thomas Easterling.

(I give this because the spelling is similar to Amyx, and the two may have been in reference to the same people at the time).

(COMMENT BY WDK). In all North Carolina Counties, I find that in the early days, little or no attention was paid to correct spelling. I have just ran across the name FLEMING. I find it spelled FLEMMING, FLEWIN, PHLEMMING, FLEMON.

The names AMYX---AMICK---AMIS---could easily be the same families. I will attempt to find out (on my own time, of course).

END OF REPORT. MORE LATER.

(COMMENT---WDK).

I feel that ITEM # 12, is about the most important record that I found in Russell or Washington Counties, since it most likely establishes the maiden name of Rebecca, wife of Thomas Easterling, Sr. They were likely married when they came to Russell County. I do not find the spelling **VICARS** in the 1790 U.S. Census of N.C., but do find VICKERS.

I have a good old friend WM. E. EASTERLING, who was for many years head of the N.C. Local Government Commission, which had supervision over all loans, bonds, and public debts, of the various cities and counties in our state of N.C. If he is alive, I will contact him for further information.

Dear Mr. Easterling:
Remarks:

It has been found that THOMAS EASTERLAN had a cancelled voucher of payment for some sort of service for WASHINGTON AND SULLIVAN COUNTIES (Tenn.) as of August 16, 1782. The only other man of the surname was William of Dobbs County about 1783.

Perhaps you would like a search, since we find the above, of the North Carolina Army Accounts. These are several large ledgers of indices that call for other ledgers, and it is quite time-consuming, and not generally advised. However in your case, where records are scarce, it is advised if you would wish to have the search made. Where a name is common, like Smith, etc., the price would be prohibitive, but in your case it would probably encompass two hours. Perhaps other and more important records would be found for Thomas, again not a single record may be found.

Stokes and Surry counties were thought more promising, and it was my wish that we just might find Thomas in the section, near to the mountains with Matthew. This was not the case, however.

In the eastern counties there is still William Easterling unaccounted for, but apparently living in 1791 in what became Jones County. There is also John Easterling unaccounted for, last with a Johnston County land grant in 1761. They probably were brothers of Rev. Henry, whose family seem to be William, the pensioner, James, Shadrack, Henry (jr), Bennett, John and Joel.

William Easterling had two vouchers, about 1783, Dobbs County.
No other Easterlings, or variation of name.

Washington and Sullivan Counties

Washington (now Tennessee) was formed in 1777 from the District of Washinton. It was roughly the territory west of Wilkes County between Wilkes and the Virginia line and the hunting grounds of the Cherokee Indians and the Mississippi River which had been allowed three representatives in the General Assembly of North Carolina in 1776.

Beginning at the most north westerly part of the County of Wilkes, on the Virginia line; thence running with the line of Wilkes County, to a point thirty-six miles south of the Virginia line; thence due west, to the ridge of the great iron mountain which heretofore divided the Hunting Grounds of the Overhill Cherokees, from those of the Middle Settlements and Valley; thence running a south westerly course, along the said ridge, the Mbe Unacoy Mountain, where the trading Path crosses the same from the valley to the Overhills; thence south with the line of this State, adjoining the State of South Carolina; thence due west, to the great River Mississippi; thence up the said River the courses thereof, to a point due west from the Beginning; thence due east with the line of this State, to the Beginning/. . . the county of Washington. . . part of the District of Salisbury. . . all part of this State lying west of Rowan County, and South of the County of Washington. . . part of the county of Burke.

Sullivan (now Tennessee) was formed in 1779 from Washington. . . by a line beginning at the Steep Rock; thence running along the dividing ridge that divides the waters of the Great Canawee and Tennessee, to the Head of Indian creek; thence along the ridge that divides the waters of Holstein and Wataga, to the mouth of Wataga; thence a direct line, the the highest part of the Chimney Top Mountain, at the Indian boundary; and all that part of said county of Washington which lies northwardly of said dividing line, shall be erected into a new and distinct county. . . Sullivan. . .

(pp. 216-217 Formation of N. C. Counties, by Corbitt)

Surry and Stokes Counties

Matthew Easterling was in Stokes County in the 1790 census, as shown by Clark's Volume 26, therefore a search of the two counties seems in order for possible other Easterlings earlier than 1790. Stokes County was formed in 1789 from Surry County, therefore the search began in Surry County, as follows:

Surry County Real Estate Conveyances, cross index (grantee and grantor), 1771-1879, reel 83, had no name of Easterling or variation.

Surry County Marriage Bonds to 1868, had no such name or names.

Surry County Wills, mf., had no name.

RESULTS OF SURRY COUNTY SEARCH: apparently Matthew Easterling did not purchase or sell property in this county, and search is extended to Stokes County, instead.

Stokes County Real Estate Conveyances are not indexed except for volume 1, 1790-1793, and one or two later volumes. The volume 1 was searched, and the following was found:

Vol. 1 p. 304. Land Grant to MATTHEW EASTERLIN, 620 acres on Buffalo and old field creek near John Rings, in line of the Moravian tract. Nov. 28, 1792, date issued, no date of entry shown here. by Alex. Martin. (Date of entry would be found at Land Grant Office, but it was certainly several years earlier, since he was in residence in the county in 1790.)

Moravian Records were then searched, Vol. 1 through Vol. 5, 1752 through 1792, and no Easterling or variation of of the name was listed.

Stokes County Marriage Bonds to 1868 had no name or variation of the name listed.

Stokes County Wills are not indexed and were not searched, however according to Olds Abstracts of Wills to 1800, MATTHEW ESTERLINE HAD A WILL probated in 1798, naming wife Anne M., son Daniel. His wife is shown as also having a will in 1799, Anna M. Esterline, naming Daniel.

Apparently this is the son shown in the 1790 census, and only one was listed. If the wills are desired, please order from courthouse.

RESULTS: Stokes County had no name of Thomas Easterling, although Matthew Easterlin(e) had a land grant here by 1792, wife Anne M., son Daniel.

Craven County Research
and Jones County Research.

Marriage Bonds to 1868 had no listing for the name.

Real Estate Conveyances, 1729-1912, grantee list page 32, and grantor list page 33, reels 118 and 103, listed only William Easterling, the first purchase being abstracted to see if it showed where he came from. He bought on July 22, 1757 from William Story, 188 acres in Craven precinct on the south side of the Neuse River. Witnesses' names were not legible. (From Vol. 2 p. 171, reel 10).

He had two sales, to Thomas Box and to Absolom Daughety, the latter in 1770. (Vol. 11 p. 40, and Vol. 18 p. 108). These two sales were not abstracted.

No other purchases or sales by any Easterling or variation of the name, including Esterling.

This is the man in Jones County ~~xxxxxx~~ of the 1791 grant, therefore wills to 1868 of Jones County were searched but no will for any of the name is listed. (From Gwynn's Abstracts.)

Johnston County Research

Marriage Bonds to 1868 had no name of Easterling or variation.

Real Estate Conveyances, 1749-1939, grantee list reel 163 and grantor list reel 167, had no such name receiving or disposing of land or slaves.

According to the Land Grant Office, Henry and John Easterling had grants 1759 and 1761 in this county. Possibly the land was put over into Dobbs County, as this is where Rev. Henry Easterling lived and where William, his son, the pensioner, was born on March 8, 1757.

Dobbs County was formed in 1758 from Johnston, and in 1764 and 1777 from Craven County.

ST. DONAT'S CASTLE

Citizen Hearst by W. A. Swanberg

Built: Early 14th Century

Size and Location: Glamorganshire, Wales--1300 acres of park
fronting on Bristol Channel 14 miles west of Cardiff.
135 rooms.

Importance: Considered one of the finest Norman buildings
in Great Britain.

Hearst's Intention: To restore St. Donat's to medieval perfec-
tion, at the same time incorporating modern conveniences.

Architect Retained: Sir Charles Allom, the most able and
expensive architect and antiquarian available. Allom
had won knighthood for his redecoration of Buckingham
Palace.

Castle Improvements: Enormous banquet hall, Elizabethan
and Jacobean paneling, dozens of bathrooms, a swimming
pool, and three tennis courts. Hearst's room was a study
in scarlet with antique red paneling, lacquer cabinets,
and a great bed bearing an engraved silver plate attesting
that Charles I had slept in the bed in 1645. The silver
service cost a quarter of a million dollars. Many antiques
which Hearst had shipped to the United States were shipped
to St. Donat's. Hearst Occupied St. Donat's for four months.

Cost: Castle--original building	120,000
Restoration and modernization	1,250,000
Total	\$1,370,000

Hearst has to sell Castle: Hearst Consolidated had to sell
everything that was not making a clear profit--St.
Donat's was put on the market. No one appeared to buy
the castle. It ate up good Organization dollars for
maintenance, until the British government requisitioned
it for use as an officers training center.

THE EASTERLING FAMILY

From a letter written to Mrs. Travis Hatch:

"The Easterling family began with Sir William de Esterling (or Easterling), in the time of William II. His descendants bore Easterling as a surname, and such was used until corrupted into the present form of the name--Stradling. The head of the family was created a Baronet (Sir John Stradling, created in 1611). The family was Welsh, and the same arms was borne irrespective of spelling. The pedigree begins with Sir William de Esterling or Easterling; his son Sir John Esterling, his son Sir Morris Esterling, whose son, Sir Robert, who first abbreviated the name to Stradling. All copies of this arms that we had were destroyed by flood in 1935. Try Mr. Fogarty and see if he can make you a print or painting."

The stripes are alternating silver and blue.

The band is red.

The three cinquefoils are gold.

The twisted wreath is silver and blue.

The mantle, like the first is the first two colors mentioned in the blazon, silver and blue.

Note: Burke also records this arms for the name Stradling. Aside from the above information none other is given. Many of the earlier arms have no crest or motto recorded.

OLD AND EXTINCT FAMILIES OF GLAMORGAN

De Esterling (Stradling) of St. Donat's Castle

We have no better account of the first entrance of this family upon Welsh territory than that given in Caradoc's Brut, to the effect that when Robert Fitzhamon took upon himself the rule and chieftainship of the whole district of Glamorgan, "to William Desterlin was allotted the lordship of Llanwerydd"--the earlier designation of St. Donat's. Of a family which in after time occupied a place almost vying in importance with that of the major barons, we have little information until this William de Esterling, or le Esterling--a name which gradually resolved itself in the popular articulation, and even in written record, into the form Stradling--took his share of the lands which Fitzhamon did homage for to Rufus, A.D. 1092 of 1094. It has been said by Collins that William de Esterling derived originally from the "eastern people called Easterlings, who dwelt near the Baltic Sea;" but whether this is anything better than a conjecture suggested by the form of the name we cannot say.

The sixth in descent after Sir William was Sir Peter Stradling, Knt., who m. Joan, sole heir of Thomas Hawey, of Cwmhawey, in Somerset, now called Comb-hay. He was succeeded by his son, Sir Edward, who m. Eleanor, dau. of Sir Gilbert Strongbow. To him and his wife, and children, William de Sancto Donato, Abbot of Neath (probably a relative), in consideration of certain concessions, gave, in 1341, "a general participation of the spiritual good things of his abbey, and founded an obit after their death, annually for ever" (see Clark's Castle of St. Donat's, 1871). In the deed executed on the occasion Sir Edward is denominated "Dominus de Sancto Donato "Anglicanus"--a description which seems to imply either a preceding of a contemporary Wallicanus Lord of St. Donat's.

The next Sir Edward, Knight of the Sepulchre, son of the last, was sent to Parliament by the co. of Somerset in the 17th Edward III., or 1344, and was Sheriff of Glamorgan in 1367. Through his wife, Gwenllian, dau. and eventually h. of Sir Roger Berkrolles, he became possessor of East Orchard and Methyr Mawr.

The Stradlings had a vein of piety and a taste for pilgrim adventure. The last-mentioned Sir Edward, and his son Sir William, both visited Jerusalem and obtained the dignity--much coveted in those days--of Knight of the Sepulchre. Sir William's son and successor, Sir Edward Stradling, also made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, and found a grave at Jerusalem about A.D. 1478. He m. Jane, dau. of Henry Beaufort, son of John of Gaunt, and in addition to a number of illegitimate children, he had by his wife, a son and successor, Sir Harry Stradling, whose story acquired a tinge of romance from his capture, while crossing the Severn estuary, by the Breton pirate, Colin Dolphin. His captor demanding a ransom price of 2,200 marks, or about 1,400 pounds, Sir Harry to meet the exaction had to sell his manor of Sutton in Glamorganshire and those of Bassaleg, Rogerster, and Tregwilym, in Monmouthshire, besides two manors in the co. of Oxford--a transaction which throws some light on the value of land and money as well as on the state of society in those days.

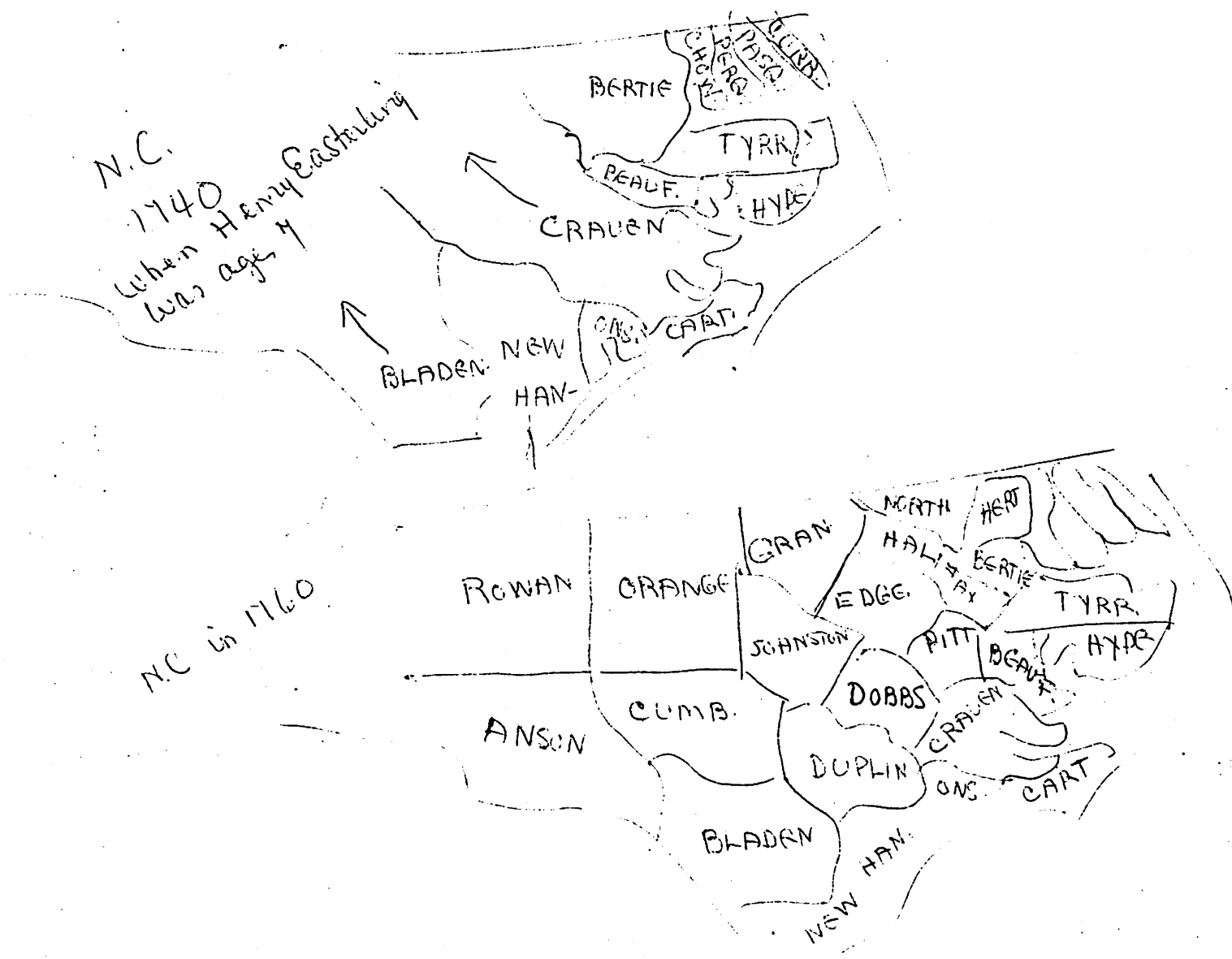

Dear Mr. Easterling: No further record of John Easterling who had a grant in 1761 on the south side of Nahunta Creek (see map) has been located at this report. William and Henry (probably father and son) were in 1780 Dobbs tax (or maybe it was the older William, as there is no way to tell - Henry's son William was 23 then). At any rate, no trace of records of your Thomas, and John simply disappears. I searched deeds of Wake and Orange for purchase and sale (both counties formed from Johnston in 1770 and 1752 respectively.) As stated in our former reports, we are in the midst of counties with lost records and it is rare that a line can be proven here. At this point there is no good recommendation that I can make except to search nearby counties such as Duplin (has lost records, also), Cumberland, and read any early court minutes that are preserved for Johnston and Craven counties. We are now looking for the needle in the haystack, and if you wish a continuance, I will get to it some time in the next two months. I am trying to complete my work for the summer and taking nothing more until Fall, due to the emergency of my Mother's illness. One thing we do know: Matthew and Anna Mary Esterline of Bethabara, Stokes County, had only one son, Daniel, and no daughters, and we eliminate him. We eliminated Henry, so all that I can say is that your Thomas might have been son of either William or John. It was the custom in olden days to name the first-born son for the paternal grandfather, and if so, it would be John as Thomas' father. This was not always the custom, though.

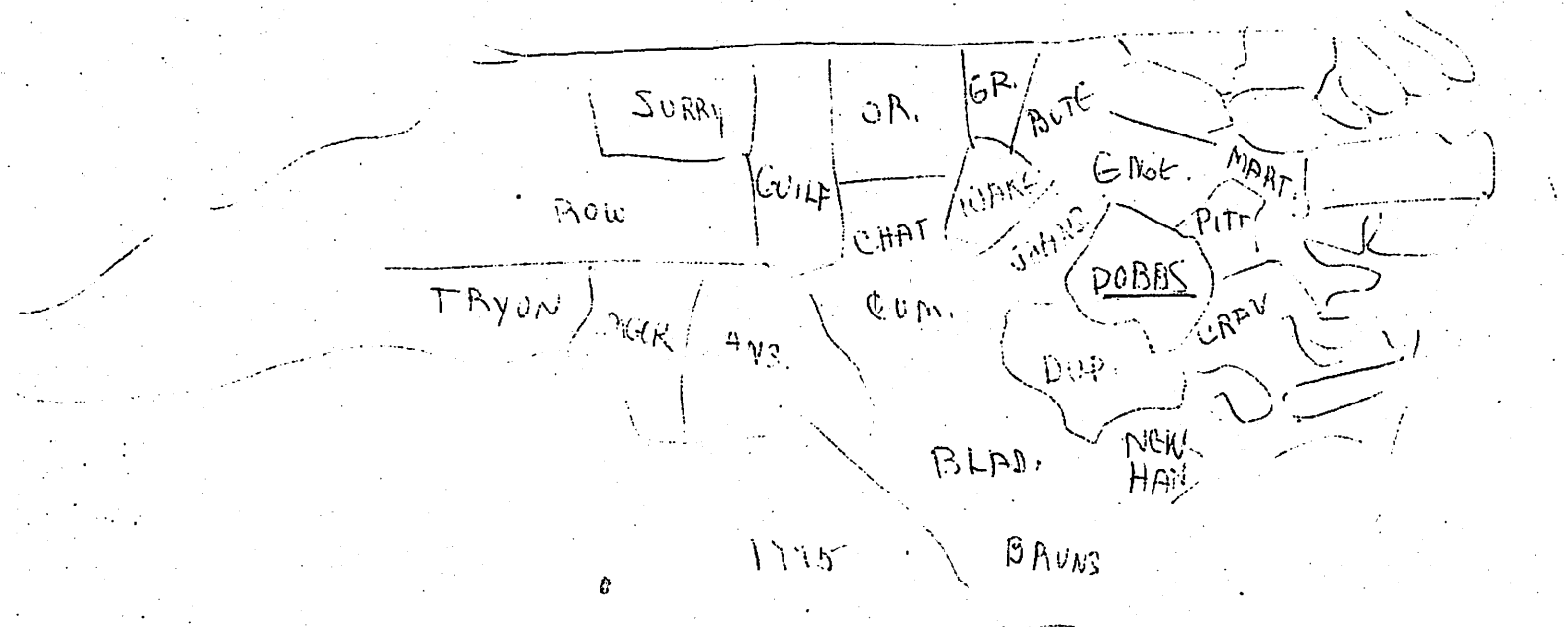
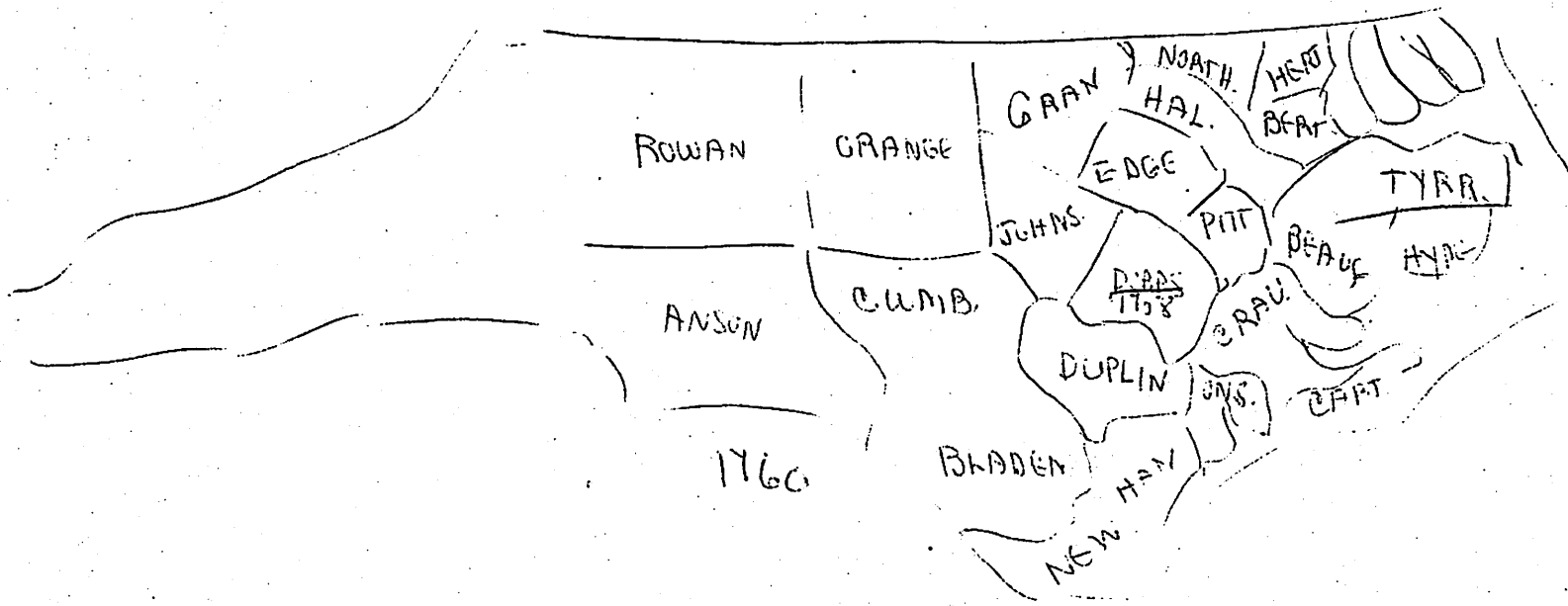

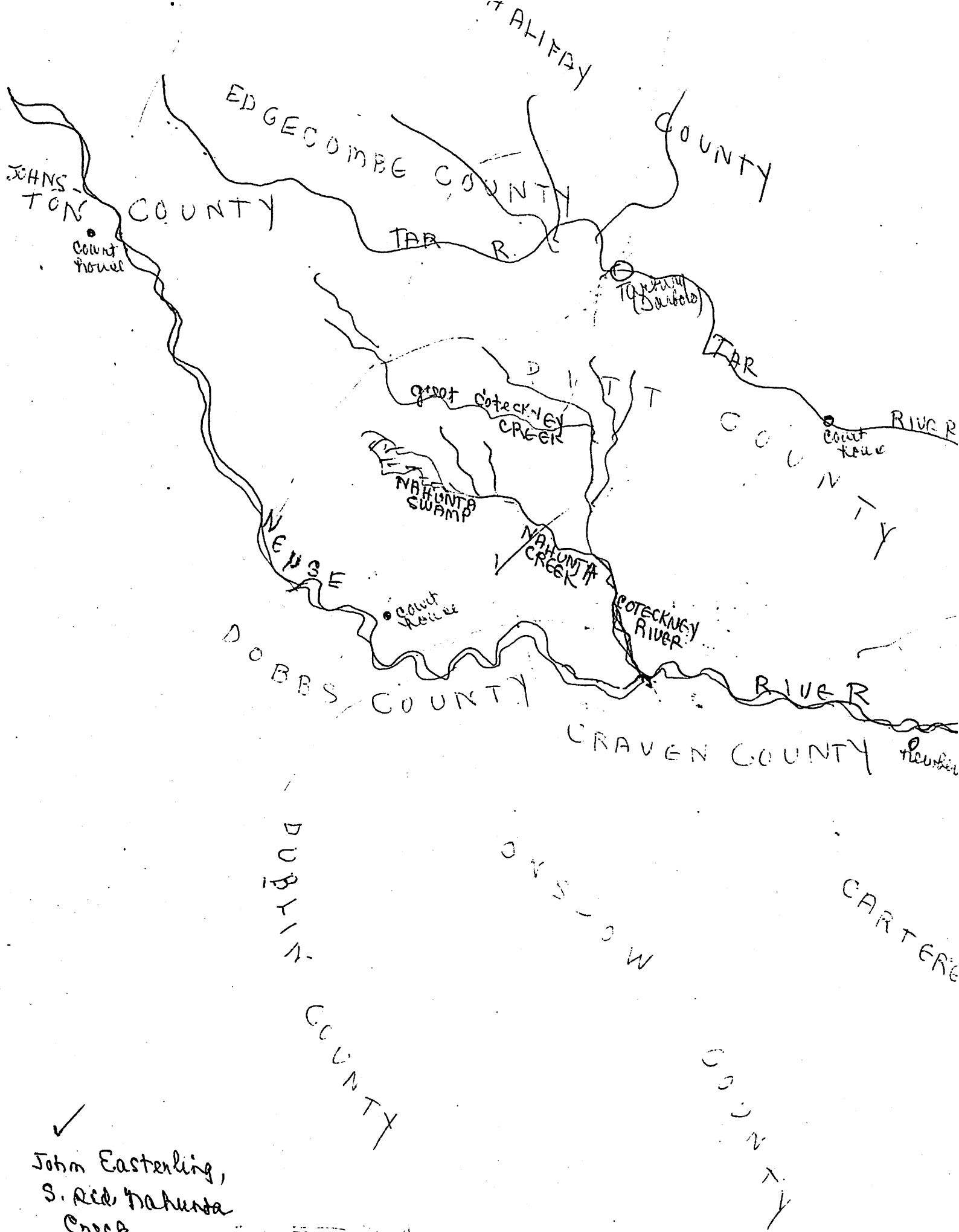

Remarks:

We are in the midst of counties with destroyed records, and it poses quite a problem. Our last record of John Easterling is in Dobbs County under date of a real estate conveyance: 1758-1765, with no possible closer date. He either removed or died in this section, and for the next report we should go through everything Dobbs County has to offer for this approximate date up to 1769. He was not listed in the 1769 tax list. Dobbs County has very little to search, but every effort should be made to obtain more information concerning him. There are also some records called N. C. Inventories, etc., many boxes of loose papers that probably should be searched. As for William Easterling, Sr., of the 1790 census, you will note that he had another male in his family over 16, but I would believe that would be William, Jr., although it is merely conjecture. A William Easterling was in Lenoir County in the 1800 census, age 26-45, born 1755-1774, but it is doubtful if this is the "Sr" in 1790, with deeds to 1822.

As for the Matthew of Stokes County, perhaps the wills should be read, page-by-page, if you have not ordered from the courthouse. I approximate time would be an hour, and this would be cheaper than ordering two wills (of Matthew and his wife) at about \$2.50 each.

I am sorry that we have not found the answer to your problem, and as you are already aware, it takes a lot of time and money, too, sometimes.

JOHNSTON COUNTY:

Craven County formed Johnston County in 1746. In a former research under date of September 15, 1964, it was stated that the grantee list reel 163 contained no name of Easterling. A correction is now made, as follows:

Henry Easterling purchased 140 acres from the State of N. C., land on a branch of Buck Swamp, in 1759. (Vol. 15 p. 259).

John Easterling purchased 150 acres from the State of N. C., land on the south side of Nahunty, in 1761. (Vol. 15 p. 346)

Both deeds were destroyed and no further information is available.

No sales of land by any Easterling or Esterling were made in this county, according to a re-check of grantor list reel 167.

No persons of this surname were listed in the Index to Wills, 1760-1961, A-Z, reel 240, devisee or deviser lists.

Marriage bonds to 1868, searched formerly, had no such names listed.

A complete abstract of the Johnston County land grants would probably be of interest in pin-pointing the land in whatever county it might be in today. In the report of January 28, 1964, it was found that Henry Easterling had two grants (one a duplicate) and John Easterling had one. These are to be found at the Land Grant Office.

DOBBS COUNTY:

Johnston County formed Dobbs County in 1758, and in 1764 and 1767 part of Craven was annexed to Dobbs County. Dobbs formed Wayne County in 1779, Glasgow and Lenoir in 1791. Greene County was formed in 1799 from Glasgow.

Dobbs County was abolished in 1791 and has few records under its own name. There are no deeds, but there is an index that was recently reconstructed, and a search of MF95 Dobbs Deeds showed:

John Easterling from Henry Easterling, 1758-1765, Vol. 6-589.
(This was not likely Henry's son, John)

A later William Easterling had the next deeds from 1798-1822 in Lenoir County, from P. and T. Collier, Lazarus Pearce Executors, Peregrine Cox.

A search of the index to "Kinston and Lenoir County" by Johnson and Holloman showed no name of Easterling or variation of the name. This book contains the 1769 Dobbs County Tax List, and a list of militiamen, therefore since no Easterling was listed, it would seem that John Easterling had removed or died before 1769.

Dobbs County has a few miscellaneous records that might be searched prior to 1769.

William Easterling, Sr. was in the 1790 census of Dobbs County, with 2 males over 16 including himself, 1 male under 16 (born 1774-1790), and 6 females including his wife. In 1800 Lenoir County census, mf., a William Easterling was 26-45, born 1755-1774, and had 2 males 10-16, born 1790-1800, and 1 female 45 or over, born 1755 or before (p. 7). This is the man who had Lenoir County deeds 1798-1822. Dobbs County formed part of Jones County in 1788 (although Jones was really formed 1778 from Craven) and it was found in a former report that a William Easterling had a 1791 grant in Jones County. Whether these records are of one man or two or more is unknown.

Glasgow records were put over into Greene County in 1799, and apparently Greene County is eliminated as to Easterlings, at any rate no Easterling was in Greene County in 1800 census, microfilm.

WAYNE COUNTY:

Dobbs County formed Wayne County in 1779, and the following records have been searched, with negative results, therefore it appears that Wayne is eliminated regarding Easterlings:

Wills and Inventories of Estates begin 1807, and three volumes through 1816 showed no name of Easterling. There is a 1786 Tax List, searched, that had no name listed.

The Cross Index to Wills begins 1780, but it was not available at the time and will be checked shortly.

Deeds, grantee list, had no name of Easterling or variation of the name. The grantor list (sales) was not searched.
