The Cave Run Doll Club met Feb. 24 at the Golden Corral Steakhouse in Mt. Sterling.


Lisa Kincaid was the January hostess with "International Dolls" as the theme. Norma Kincaid was February hostess with "Valentine's Day" as the theme.
