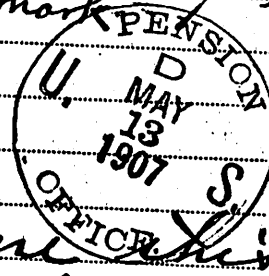

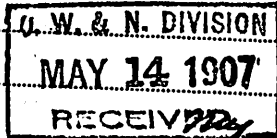

Jeffrey Lee Estep, 21, of Cranston Road, Morehead, died Sunday in the St. Claire Medical Center at Morehead.

He died at 12:30 a.m. of injuries sustained in an accident on an all-terrain, three-wheel vehicle about 9 miles north of Morehead near KY 377.

Off-road vehicle driver fatally injured

MOREHEAD — Kentucky State Police are investigating the death of a Rowan County man early Sunday in an off-road vehicle accident.

Jeffery L. Estep, 21, of Route 2, Morehead, was killed when his three-wheeled all-terrain vehicle struck a pile of wood and overturned about 12:30 a.m.

The accident occurred 9.5 miles north of Morehead near Ky. 377.

Estep, who was not wearing a helmet, was thrown from the vehicle, and died of multiple injuries, said a KSP dispatcher at the Morehead post. Estep was pronounced dead at St. Claire Medical Center by Dr. Robert Young.

Trooper Shelby Lawson is the investigating officer.
