Last night as I went to sleep, I began to think of all the possibilities that could create such confusion. A man with two families could be one answer; however, this man also has two graves. Therefore, two separate men is a more likely solution.

The Walter S.listed on your cemetery list has a different birth and death date than the Walter Scott, child of William A. and Evaline Thomas Fouch. My Walter Scott was fourteen when your Walter was born and died at 58 years of age. Yours lived to 91 years of age. Your Walter born 8-28-1869, died 10-3-1960, buried in Ironton, Ohio.

Is it possible that William M. Fouch, son of William Adison Fouch, brother of Walter Scott Fouch, had a son Walter S. The age of William M. would allow for this solution. William M. would have been 19 when your Walter S. was born in 1869. William M. might have moved to Ironton. I know he was still in Rowan County during the Martin-Tolliver Feud but I have not tried to trace him beyond that.

William Adison may have lived in Ironton with a son or grandson at his death - if so I would like to know his history and would love pictures if any are available. I have access to pictures of Walter Scott.

I hope the confusion can be straightened out. Walter Scott is where we have the problem. I even have Walter Scott's Bible and Lucy and Normie's Bible indicating their marriage in Walter Scott's home. Any my grandparents, Lucy and Normie, lived with Martha Ann after Walter Scott's death in 1912 (after the Haldeman brick yard closed where my grandfather worked.) My mother, Edna, Uncle Walter and Aunt Betty Evelyn were born in that house.

I am thinking possibly your tree would be: William A. to William M. to Walter S. to Ted Basil to Roy E. Fouch. Just guessing I don't know. Who was your Grandmother...Walter S.'s wife?

Next time I visit the genealogical library, I will try to find your William and Walter in Ironton and see if there are any easy or obvious solutions.

THE CHRISTY FAMILY OF PLATTE COUNTY, MISSOURI

h y RICHARD HOPKINS November 11, 1992

James W. Christy wrote down his family history in 1846, up to that time. I will recount what James W. Christy has written and two of his source letters; also the history of the Christy family as I know it after their arrival in Platte County.

As far as I can tell, Samuel Christy emigrated from England prior to 1730 and settled in Essex County, Virginia, and was the first of the Christys in America that eventually settled in Platte County. Samuel died sometime prior to 1752. His entire estate went to Samuel, the oldest son, in accordance with Virginia law.

As far as is known, he was married when he came to America. He had four children, two boys and two girls that we are aware of. There may have been more children. These are the ones that we know about:

- 1. Samuel II, born before 1730. In 1753, Samuel and his entire family died from smallpox. Samuel inherited all the land and the slaves of his father. All of the slaves that Samuel owned, except one negro man, also died from smallpox. Upon the death of Samuel, Julins inherited all of his property.
- 2. Mildred, born c. 1730. Mildred married a man named Blackburn and had four children, two boys and two girls. Blackburn died about 1770 and Julius Christy raised the two Blackburn boys, George and Julius, and trained them to be carpenters. After they were grown, George and Julius Blackburn moved to Woodford County, Kentucky. Their mother, Mildred later married a man named Medley. Mr. Christy did not keep or have any further records pertaining to this branch of the family that I can find.
- 3. Juda (Judy) (twin to Julins) born c. 1731. Juda (Judy) married a man named John Gibbs, a cousin of Agatha Barnett. She and her husband resided in Culpepper County, Virginia. John Gibbs was a farmer.
- 4. Julins, born c. 1731, and died c. 1810 in Clark County, Kentucky. Julins was been apprenticed to a James Booker to learn the carpenter trade. Julins married Agatha Barnett, daughter of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, on October 30, 1756 in Orange County, Virginia. John Barnett was the son of John and Ann Barnett. Marran was the daughter of Dr. John Gibbs and his wife Mary of Middlesex County. John and Marran were married on November 13, 1725. About this time Julins and Agatha moved to Culpepper County, Virginia. Sometime later, he purchased some land on the Rapidan River and built a mill which he operated for about 20 years. He had land in both Culpeper and Orange County, Virginia. Sometime during the early 1770s, the mill was destroyed by a flood. Julins rebuilt the mill, then he sold it. Sometime after the sale he and his family moved to Greenbrier County, in what is now West Virginia. They lived there a few years, then moved to Kentucky. Based on John's letter, Julins and Agatha are buried on the farm that John Christy

owned in Clark County, Kentucky. Julins and Agatha had the following children:

- 1. Agatha Christy, born c. 1760 in Culpeper County, Virginia, married Francis Robert Kirtley and died between 1808 and 1812 in Kentucky.
- 2. Ann Christy, born c. 1763 in Culpeper County, Virginia, married John Valentine Lindsey in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now West Virginia) in 1779, died after 1813.
- 3. George Christy, born c. 1767, married a woman named Mary, lived in Greenbrier County for a period and later moved to Boone County, Kentucky where he died in January of 1804.
- 4. Ambrose Christy, born November 10, 1768, married Mary (Molly) Bush on June 18, 1794, in Clark County, Kentucky, died on July 18, 1839, in Clark County, Kentucky.
- 5. John Christy, born November 15, 1769. John wrote one of the letters in this article. (See part on James below)
- 6. James Christy, born c. 1766. He was married to a woman named Elizabeth and she died August 1, 1843. They lived in Fleming County, Kentucky near the village of Poplar Plains. I am not sure when James died. James wrote one of the letters in this article.
- 7. Frances Christy, born c. 1766, married William Cave on July 11, 1783, in Culpeper County, Virginia, died about 1860 in Caddo Parish, Louisiana.
- 8. Sarah Christy, married Elijah Davis on September 21, 1790 in Woodford County, Kentucky.
- 9. Samuel Christy, born c. 1783, married Mary (Polly) Day in 1805 in Fleming County, Kentucky, died during the 1850's in either Decatur or Bartholomew County, Indiana.

This is a copy of the letter written by James Christy. We do not know to who this or the following letter was written to. We know that it was not written to any of the children of John or James as both men referred to the recipient as nephew. The nephew was the son of the person that was taking care of Agatha at the time of her death, if John's letter is correct.

Poplar Plains, Ky Dec 7th 1844

My Dear Nephew,

In compliance with your request to ascertain through me the facts relating to the history of the Christy family. I take my seat after so long a time to do so.

I should have done it before the present, but have been delayed in the hope, that by conversing with the relations etc to collect more general and

accurate information than I had in my procession when your letter came to hand

am not positive whether the 1st Christy came from England or Scotland. I am of the opinion that he came from the latter. This man I think was Samuel. I am unable to state at what time he landed, but it must have been prior to 1730 as my Father-your Grandfather Julius was born after his arrival in Essex County, Va and lived to be 79 years of age, and subsequently migrated to Clark Co, Ky and there died, somewhere about 1810. My Grandfather was married when he came to America and died in Va. Julius Christy my Father was the first that married and he was married in Culpepper Co Va. He married Aga Barnett of the same Co. at about his 22 or 23 year. I have no knowledge of my Grandfathers occupation whatever. He had five children-three sons and two daughters two of whom were twins, to wit your Grandpa and eldest daughter Judy who were the first born. Milly the next and Samuel next to her and the other son whose name I do remember was the last.

The occupation of Julius was that of a house carpenter and farmer. Judy married a man by the name of John Gibbs and resided in Culpepper Co Va until her death. Her husband was a farmer. She died about 35 years ago. Milly married a man by the name of Medlev also a farmer & of the same County where she died before Judy. Samuel about the time of Braddocks defeat migrated towards the Red Stone County on the Ohio above Wheeling and no intelligence has ever been received from him since by me. His occupation I never knew. The last one died early in life, and I have no recollection of his occupation more than that he was the youngest Brother of my Father. My Mother Aga Barnett I am positive came from Scotland descent. Her father being a Scotchman and migrated at early period in the last century to the Colonies. I have but little knowledge of the history of my Uncles and Grandfather, but this I have been told, that they were Soldiers, or most of them were in the Revolutionary war. Julius, my Father entered the war at its commencement and continued on until near the close. No stains rests upon the name from them. They sustained and honorable and respectable character as far as I have been able to learn, and enjoyed that position in Society which all honest and uprightmen sustain. I am happy to learn through you and others that you and the rest of your Brothers are doing so well.

It is truly a great satisfaction for me to comtemplate the members of all the family pursuing that safe and honorable course in life which leads both to happiness & fortune.

As for myself and children we are all doing very well.

I am now a widower, on the 1st day of last August was one year I lost my wife. But I possefs a vigor and health both of body and mind not withstanding. I am 78 years of age which deserves for me another almost another wife

Few men of my age can perform half the toil and labor that I can. Still I am far from the prime of manhood, and according to the course of nature not far from the grave.

And in conclusion accept the affection of your dear Uncle

James Christy Sr.

Here is the copy of the letter written by his brother, John, father of Mr. James W. Christy of Platte County, Mo

Dec 25, 1844

Dear Nephew.

Your letter for the first time came duly to hand, requesting me to give you a statement of your Fathers and my Fathers ancestors on both sides of our family, for you and my son Simion P. Christy to meditate upon when you meet in the City of Philadelphia.

In the first place I have no record that is that far back to relate from, only as Father and Mother related verbably and that I can only rely on as truth not to be desirid. My Father descended from the English. Your Uncle James Christy is entirely mistaken, about our ancesters and your father, there is no Scotch blood nor Irish, in my Fathers side of the family nor Dutch either.

As to the time that the first Christy emigrated to American I have no genealogy that states it. My Father Julins Christy and his twin sister by the name of Juda was the youngest of his Fathers family, and there were but four children of his family, two sons and two daughters. The oldest son was named Samuel, and the oldest daughter perhaps was Mildred. I don't so well recollect her first name however. She married a man of the name of Blackburn, by which she had four children, two sons and two daughters, and when Blackburn died and the widow being Fathers, oldest sister, requested him, as he was a good carpenter, already grown and married to my mother, to take her two Sons and raise them and School them, and learn them the carpenters trade and he did so: and from them sprang all the Blackburns in the Woodford Co Ky. George and Julins were their names. After Father took her two sons, she lived a widow about a year and married a man by the name of Medley, a very respectable man, and raised the two daughters and they married well, for I know the two men myself well. Take notice, my Father long before that time had a Brother by the name of Samuel, and as old Virginia as she is now, was that time very much out of her senses by electing an ignoramous instead of the wisest men of the world, had it in her code of laws in that day, that if any man died without a will the oldest Son should heir all his Estate. His brother Samuel being the oldest child of the four became heir at law, and having all the negros and land, having a family himself, and my Father being an apprentice bound to one James Booker to learn the carpenter trade, was still working from home, and as God would have it Small pox fell in Sam Christy's family, caught in the natural way and killed him and black and white everyone but one negro man, and he barely escaped, being badly marked, as I

often noticed, for he felled to my Father by the same unjust-law, and my Father missed catching disease by working away from home. His Father and Mother being dead sometime before, that in the natural way his Sister a twin to him, while he was apprentice I expect was mostly raised by her oldest Sister; they being some distance from where the Small pox raged they did not take it.

His youngest Sister by the name of Juda, after Father grew up, married my Mothers Cousin by the name of John Gibbs, and became in fine circumstances. My Father after he learned his trade took his Negro man and moved up the country to Culpepper and Orange Counties of Va, where he followed his trade until he got married to my Mother Agatha Barnett. My Father was born and raised low down in Va, somewhere near a town called Suffolk in county called Gloucester and King and Queen and one by the name of Essex along near the mouth of York river

If his Father died before he was born I do not know it. But I don't think he did, through he was very small at least. He was much attached to Capt John Gibbs, that married his Sister, through he injured him in the long run very much.

There is a little of the Scotch blood mixed in one part of our ancestors, through it came from my Grand Father Barnett. All the other side of my Grand Mothers were of the English. Grand Father Barnett died when he was 45 years of age and his wife never would marry any more. He left her with two plantations and about thirty negros and a fever fell amongest them and killed nine before it stopped. She carried her plantation very well, kept an overseer, made great crops, until she died.

My Father brought land on the pretty little river called Rapidan in Culpepper Co and Orange Co both and built him a mill which run for 18 or 20 years, and the came a great freshet, and move her away, and he rebuilt again and sold out in time of the old Revoltion and moved to Green Brair Co high up in Va. staid there about 9 years and moved to ky. where he died on my place where I now live and I had him decently buried, and Mother died at your Fathers about 15 years afterwards and your Father sent her up to me and I had her buried by his side decently.

If that John Christy that lives in St Louis is any kin to me which William Christy of New Orleans say he is, he must be a son of my Grand Fathers Brothers, and he is the one that migrated to Pittsburgh as my Brother James represented. It is possible that my brother James Christy might have heard my Father relate in his time something of his ancestors that I do not know

If it ever proves convenient for you to give me a call as your trips through Ky. I will give you satisfactory relation of all our relatives that is in my power to do now. I must conclude by subscribing myself as your affectionate Uncle till death

John Christy

John Christy was born on November 15, 1769. John married Hannah Whaley about 1798 in Kentucky. John died June 9, 1848, in Clark County, Kentucky. Hannah was born in 1777, and died at the home of her daughter, Frances, on June 15, 1855. She is buried in the Hunt Family Graveyard in Clark County, Kentucky. They lived in Clark County, southeast of Lexington, Kentucky. They had the following children;

- 1. James W. Christy was born March 10, 1800, at Georgetown, Kentucky.
- 2. Mary (Molly) Christy, married Dr. Orville Collins on October 6, 1819, in Clark County, Kentucky. She died in 1875.
- 3. Garland Christy, married Margaret Hickey on August 26, 1848, in Lexington, Kentucky.
- 4. Julius Christy, born September 8, 1805, in Clark County, Kentucky, married Margaret Franklin, died in 1895 in Clark County, Kentucky.
- 5. Frances Christy, born October 15, 1808, in Clark County, Kentucky, married Jeptha Hunt, died October 5, 1896 in Clark County.
- 6. Nancy Christy, born in 1810 in Clark County, Kentucky, married Marcus C. Evans on November 14, 1831 in Clark County and died in 1891,
- 7. Susan Christy, born in 1812, married Silas Evans Jr. on January 22, 1833, in Clark County, Kentucky and died in 1890.
- 8. Simeon P. Christy, died in 1881.
- 9. Elizabeth Christy, born in 1807 in Clark County, Kentucky, died September 3, 1833.
- 10. John Christy, died October 3, 1831 in Lexington, Kentucky.

James W. Christy

James W Christy was born March 10, 1800 at Georgetown, Kentucky. He married Elizabeth Nichols of Winchester. Kentucky on August 28, 1828. In 1842 he moved to Platte County, Mo and took up farming. In addition he operated a light freight and passenger service three times a week between Platte City and Leavenworth. In 1865 he became totally blind and had to give up his life's work. His farm was located just south of Platte City. He died on January 21, 1879 and was buried on the family farm. His wife died on June 15, 1884 and was buried along side of her husband. Platte City has now reached the Christy farm and it was necessary to move the remains of those buried in the family cemetery to the Platte City Cemetery. A house now stands where the small cemetery was for more than one hundred years. Their children were:

- 1. William T. Christy, born in Scott County, Kentucky, November 24, 1829 and married Ellen Mormon on November 2, 1860. They resided in Clay County, Missouri. I haven't been able to learn anything about this family.
- 2. Mary A. Christy, born March 10, 1833 and married John H. Berryman on December 25, 1852. John died in November 1866 and was buried on the Christy farm. Mary died on October 6, 1868 and was buried beside her husband. They had the following children:
- a. Bettie Berryman.
- b. Sophronia Berryman. Sophronia married William L. Moore on October 19, 1886.
- c. Mary E. Berryman born January 3, 1858 and died September 16, 1858. Mary was buried on the Christy farm.
- d. James William Berryman born May 20, 1860 and died May 4, 1865 and was buried on the Christy farm.
- 3. Nancy H.(Nannie) Christy born January 7, 1835 married Elbert Osborne (Ob) Waller, son of Hiram Waller and Eliza Jane Gaines, on December 2, 1855. They lived on a farm two miles east of Platte City. Mr. Waller died on May 31, 1898. After Mr. Waller's death, Nannie made her home with her son. After his death on August 23, 1900, she made her home with her sister Mrs Henry C. Mann. Death seemed to follow Nannie as her sister died shortly after Nannie came to live with her. Nannie died January 19, 1901 at the home of her brother-in-law, Richard L Waller, who she had gone to visit and to consult with on some business affairs. The Wallers had one son, Richard Lewis II, who was born April 17, 1863, and died August 23, 1900. He was married to Lou Tatman on November 24, 1891. Lou was the daughter of James Tatman and Elizabeth Story. Lou was born May 26. 1867 and died May 11, 1955. Lou was one of the most beautiful women in Platte County in her youth. Lou and Richard did not have any children. Nannie and her husband are buried in the Platte City Cemetery, Riverview Part Two, along with their son and daughter-in-law
- 4. Elizabeth F (Lizzie) Christy born November 11, 1839. Lizzie married Frederick Krause on May 10, 1863. She died of flux on June 30, 1864. According to the history of the area, a great number of people died of flux (excessive or

unnatural discharge of fluid matter from the body) about this time. She was buried on her father's farm. They did not have any children. Mr. Krause was the son of Gottlieb Krause and Augusta Hesse and was born in Prussia March 27, 1837. He came to America in 1852 and lived in St Louis and Memphis before settling in Platte City on March 26, 1859. He was a butcher in Platte City. After Lizzie's death, he married Nancy Duncan on September 26, 1866. Mr. Krause died of kidney failure on September 11, 1894.

- 5. Luanna A. Christy born June 17, 1848. She is listed as a student at the Platte City Female Academy for the year 1858/1859. She married Henry C. Mann on December 15, 1875. They lived on a farm about two miles north of Platte City. She died in 1900 a few weeks before her sister, Nannie, died. They had one son Leon who was born in 1887 and died in 1892. Mrs Mann, her husband and child are all buried in the Platte City Cemetery, Riverview Part Two.
- 6. Susan H. (Sue) Christy born on February 16, 1846. She is listed as a student at the Platte City Female Academy for the year 1858/1859. She married Thomas Braxton George on March 16, 1870. They made their home on the Christy family farm. After the death of her husband, she went to Colorado Springs to live with Miriam (Minnie). She died May 1, 1922 in Colorado Springs, Colorado . Sue and her husband are both buried in the Platte City Cemetery. They had four children:
- a. Miriam (Minnie) born about 1873. She married first to Henry Shirley, married second to Edward Martin, she lived in Colorado Springs, Colorado. They did not have any children. She died October 29, 1951 and is buried in Colorado Springs.
- b. Unnamed child born in 1876 and died the same year and buried in the Christy Family Cemetery.
- c. Rufus W. George, born about 1877, married first to Cora McClain and they had one son Cody, born January 10, 1900. Cora died in 1900 and is buried in the Platte City Cemetery. Cody did not turn out well and I am told that he took up a life of crime. I think that he was dead before I was born as I never met him and my folks always said he was dead. Rufus married second Ella Jones. Rufus was a butcher in Platte City. Rufus and his family lived on the George (Christy) family farm until they moved to Meriden, Kansas in 1924. From 1924, until he retired in 1950, he had a butcher shop in Meriden, Kansas. Rufus died March 12, 1958 at his home in Meriden, Kansas. Ella died March 17, 1960 at a n wrsing home in Topeka, Kansas. Rufus and his wife are buried in the Meriden Cemetery, Meriden, Kansas. Rufus and Ella had the following children:
- (1) John C. George. I am not sure when he was born and I have been told that he died in the Mobile, Alabama area about 1975. I was also told that he made a career of the Air Force and was retired from the Air Force at the time of his death.
- (2) Helen Naomi George was born March 12, 1907. She married Leo Scales and lived for a period in Kansas City. They had one child, a daughter name Jean Marie Scales, with whom Naomi lived with in St Louis, Missouri. Jean is married to Steven Hinds and they live at 4946 Southridge Park Drive, St Louis, Missouri 63129. Leo died at his home in Kansas City, Kansas on September 8,

1961, and was buried in the Meriden Cemetery, Meriden, Kansas. Helen Naomi died September 10, 1989.

- (3) Wesley Braxton George, born February 24, 1910. He married Herma Toomay. He lived a number of years in Topeka, Kansas working for John Morrell Meat Packing Company for 27 years as a salesman. In 1960 he moved to Kansas City and work for the Kansas City Water Department until he retired in 1974. He died June 6, 1981, and is buried in the Mount Moriah Cemetery, Kansas City, Missouri.
- d. Pearl Virginia was born about 1879 and was married a Mr. Christal. They lived in Topeka, Kansas. She had two daughters Susan Frances and Christine. I do not know the names of the men that the daughters married. I do know that Pearl had one grandson named Richard (Dickie).
- e. Claude born October 20, 1880. He married Madeleine Waller March 12, 1902. She was the daughter of F. L. Waller and Minnie Johnston. They lived on the Waller farm about five miles east of Platte City until 1941, when they moved to Platte City. They had two children, Kendrick Waller George, born January 10, 1903 and died August 12, 1956, no children, and Christine Virginia George, born August 4, 1905, and died April 13, 1978. She married Paul Hopkins and had four children, Paula Virginia, James Richard, Joseph Francis and Helen Sue. Claude died February 3, 1948 and is buried along with his wife and son in the Platte City Cemetery.

In August 1987, the cemetery located on the old Christy farm was moved to the Platte City Cemetery to made room for the new houses that were being constructed. While I have mentioned each of those that were buried in the Christy Cemetery I will list them again.

James W. Christy, born March 10, 1800, died January 21, 1879.

Elizabeth Nicholas, wife of James W. Christy, born, died June 15, 1884.

John H. Berryman, died November, 1866.

Mary A. Christy, wife of John H. Berryman, born March 10, 1833, died October 6, 1868.

Mary E Berryman, daughter of John and Mary, born January 3, 1858, died September 15, 1868.

James William Berryman, son of John and Mary, born May 20, 1860 died May 4, 1865.

Elizabeth F. Christy, daughter of James and Elizabeth and wife of Frederick Krause, born November 11, 1839, died June 30, 1864.

Unnamed George baby, son of Thomas B. George and Susan Christy, born and died in 1876.

The letters written about 140 years ago made good reading and I enjoyed reading them. I am not sure about their accuracy in some places. I have been

I Remember her Grandmother, Mrs Mary Varnor, she lived to the age of more than 90 years, and never wore Spectacles. She read much, and taught many children to read, one of which was my Wife's Mother.





HUGH & MARY PERKINS (PARKINS) FOUCH

All of us who can trace our ancestry to the early 18th century are descendants of Hugh and Mary Parkins Fouch. Their grandson, Thomas, wrote a statement that Hugh was born in America in 1696 after his parents fled Brittany, France, during the massive Huguenot exodus after the revocation of the Edict of Nantes.

According to a family bible, Mary Parkins (Perkins) came from Bucks Co., PA, which was a Quaker community. We have found records of five sons. Four were mentioned in Hugh's will in 1780, and the fifth, John, died when he was a young man.

We know from the family bible that feac was the first son,
and born in 1721. Abraham was listed as executor of Hugh's
will. The others were John, Jacob, and Jonathan.

Beginning in 1752 Hugh seemed to have a running battle with Philip Noland with suits and countersuits of charges of trespass. It is probable that boundaries were so ill-defined that the only accepted resolution was in a court of law.

Mary Parkins Fouch and Hugh had a great-grandson born in Georgia in 1808 who was named Isaac Perkins Fouch. There is a probability that he was named for his grandfather, Isaac, who may have been named Isaac Perkins (or Parkins) Fouch.

Frequently the first son was named for the maternal grandfather. It is quite likely that Mary's father was named "Issac." At the time, a Quaker named Isaac Parkins lived in Winchester, VA, 30 miles to the west. He had a large family of children whose names were somewhat similar to the children of Mary. Although no confirming records have yet been found, he may have been her brother.

Hugh died in 1780. He made his first will on October 28, 1772, probably during a time of illness. This was witnessed by James Abbett, Joseph Abbett and Joseph Collings (Collins). The original will was kept in his desk, and during a final illness, this was up-dated on September 24, 1780, with new witnesses. The old date and witnesses were crossed out, but the date and names can still be gleaned from the original document. A copy from the original, follows:

"Loudoun County, the 28th of October 1772 In the Name of God, Amen. I knowing the certinty of Death and at this time being sound of mind i recommend my Soul to the Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a desent maner.

1th. T desire all my just debts and funarel charges to be paid.

2th. I give and bequath to deer and well beloved wife Mary Fouch all my personal estate during her natural life.

3th. At her deseas i give and bequath to my well beloved Sun Isack Fouch five Shilings current mony.

4th. I order the daughter of Isack Fouch named Mary three pound(s) corrant mony.

5th I order that the remander be equilly be devided betwen my well beloved sons Jacob fouch, Jonathon fouch and abraham fouch or thier heirs. i also renouns all other or former wills and testaments but this only one and do desire my well beloved wife to be my sole executerix of this my

It does not appear from the will that Hugh left a substantial estate. It also seems that he never learned to sign his signature. In those days, even sons of well educated parents sometimes received no education when they arrived in the colonies. Life was full of peril, and mere survival probably took all of their resources.



The last letter received from you was dated Nov.13, to which I replied. I have been anxiously awaiting to hear from you again. Perhaps. I did not give you all the old history you expected, and hence delayed writing. I hope nothing worse has prevented you from writing and now that I have written out the family history as I received it from my grandmother, Mary McQueen, wife of Daniel Thomas, and a younger brother of your ancestor. You can complete it perhaps,

Family History

Dr. Elijah Hart, a Spanish Don of Seville, Spain, emigrated to Germany and became a German Baron. He lived in his Castle (presumably on the Rhine). He had a daughter, Eva Susanna Margaret (named for her three god-mothers). She and her brothers, when nearly grown, were sent with other sons and daughter of equal rank to a dancing and finishing school near the seashore. One Saturday afternoon they were given a halfholiday and went down to the wharf where a sailing vessel lay at anchor. They heard music on board. The Captain politely invited them on the ship where they could hear the music better. Four couples accepted the invitation. Eva and her brother were among them The vessel was swaying with the motion of the waves, and before they were aware of it, the ship was under sail.. Pleading and tears were of not avail, for they were kidnapped by one of the pirate ships that infested the seashore at that time. They were rudely treated, and feared for their lives. Eva had a considerable sum of money, so her friends persuaded her to deposit it with the clerk and take a receipt. One of each sex dies on the way. When the ship landed, Eva presented the receipt for her money. The pirates cursed her and said the receipt was a forgery. They were all sold to Mary land farm owners for three years service to "pay for their passage". They were put out in the field to work under an overseer, like slaves. Eva's tender hands soon became swollen milling flax, but she had to work on. when her term of service had expired the son of a wealthy neighbor had learned her history and realizing her married her. Soon she was surrounded with luxury as she had been used to in her home in Germany.

MICHAEL THOMAS, served in the French-Indian War. Records show Col. Washington requested to Culpepper Co. Va. to furnish 80 men to build roads and fortifications on the Potomac River near Cumberland. Michael Thomas was one of these men, after six months of work and with cold weather setting in they protested the lack of food and clothing and requested permission to return home until Spring. Their Captain assented providing they complete the fort on the south branch of the Potomac River, which they did. Spring came and ten of: the men failed to return and were classed as deserters. House, of Burgess records show they were tried by court martial, but were not found guilty of desertion, but they were fined the amount of pay due them for their six months of time they had served.

radition says: that JOHN THOMAS early settler and plantation owner in Virginia paid 50 pounds of tobacco for one of the girls that were shipped over from England to beome wives of the planters. The 250 pounds of tobacco was to pay the passage of these omen and girls on the ships from England to Virginia. The new world of Virginia planations had a terrible shortage of marriageable women and the planters requested help rom England, as there was no white women handy and it was dangerous hunting and trying to catch an Indian maiden in the wilderness. The crown picked a couple hundred oung maidens of good report and character, these were mostly orphans, and ghipped them wilderness. Now how the men picked out their wives I have never been able to find out. Maybe the intermediate could advise me. Whether the biggest man got the first pick, or maybe the irls had a choice—which I have my doubts about. I imagine with the shortage of women and girls for marriage there wasn't much fussing and most were pretty well satisfied, on if some did get the skinny, scrawny ugly ones.

cording to tradition in the family Eva Susanna Margarita Hart, second wife of Michel Thomas, was the daughter of a Spanish Lord, and her father owned a castle on the ine River, where she was well educated, for that time, as women didn't recieve as much ucation as the men. It is said Eva Susanna and a girl frienchere in Holland and while the port of Asterdam they were intrigued by the sailing ships and the trading going .A Captain of one of the ships offered to show them around the ship, but when they re ready to leave they found they were prisoners and the vessel soon sailed for the w world America. They landed in Maryland and both were leased out to planters to pay r their passage. They worked in the flax fields as indentured servants until one day ey got away and Eva married Michael. This sounds rather far-fetched from Ireland to ain to Germany. My theory; if this is true is, since lots of titled Irish were in rebelon against the English crown and being educated and versed in ... refere fled to various ies in Europe where they offered their services to that country. Susanna's father i grand father could have been some of these people, possibly settling along the Rhine i becoming important in the area accquired a castle and wealth enough to educate sanna and allow her to travel..
