

Descendants of Lewis J. GREEN Sr.

First Generation

1. Lewis J. GREEN Sr. was born about 1724 in, Prince George County, Virginia. He died in Oct 1784 in Blue Spring Rd., Near Glasgow, Kentucky (then Virginia).

He was a Private who served under Captain Robert McKenzie in Tennessee and Kentucky. He was stationed at Fort Nashboro in Nashville, Tennessee. He served in the French and Indian War.

He enlisted in Capt Robert McKenzie's Co from Dinwiddie Co., VA at age 30 at the rank of Private in the French and Indian War and also served in the Rev War in VA.

He was a vestryman in the church at Kilgore Station (Church of England?) and was very brown in complexion.

Lewis owned 41 acres of land adjacent to Porter's Fort in March of 1774.

A story about Lewis Green, Sr. told by Daniel Boone
Occurred near the Clinch River

Lewis and a brother-in-law, who resided near Blackmore's, on Clinch, about fifteen miles below Captain Gass' place, where Boone was sojourning, went out some considerable distance among the mountains to hunt. They selected a good hunting range, erected a cabin, and laid up in store's some jerked bear meat. One day when Green was alone, his companion being absent on the chase, a large bear made his appearance near camp, upon which Green shot and wounded the animal, which at the moment chanced to be in a sort of sink-hole at the base of a hill. Taking a circuit to get above and head the bear there being a slight snow upon the ground covered with sleet, Green's feet slipped from under him, and in spite of all his efforts to stop, himself, he partly slid and partly rolled down the declivity till he found himself in the sink-hole, where the wounded bear, enraged by his pain, flew at poor Green, tore and mangled his body in a shocking manner, totally destroying one of his eyes. When the bear had sufficiently gratified his revenge by gnawing his unresisting victim as as he wished, he suddenly departed, leaving the unfortunat hunter in a helpless and deplorable condition, all exposed, with his clothing torn in tatters, to the severities of the season.

His comrade at length returning, found and took him to camp. After awhile, thinking it impossible for Green to recover, his companion went out on pretense of hunting for fresh meat, and unfeelingly abandoned poor Green to his fate, reporting in the settlements that he had been killed by a bear. His [Green] little fire soon died away from his inability to provide fuel. Digging, with his knife, a hole or nest beside him in the ground-floor of his cabin, he managed to reach some wild turkey which had been saved, and with them lined

the excavation and made himself quite a comfortable bed; and with the knife fastened to the end of a stick, he cut down, from time to time, bits of dried bear meat hanging over head, and upon this he sparingly subsisted. Recovering slowly, he could at length manage to get about. When spring opened, a party, of whom Boone is believed to have been on, went from Blackmore's settlement to bury Green's remains, with the brute of a brother-in-law for a guide; and to their utter astonishment, they met Green plodding his way towards home, and learned the sad story of his sufferings and desertion. The party were so indignant that they could scarcely refrain from laying violent hands on a wretch guilty of so much inhumanity to a helpless companion. Green though greatly disfigured lived many years.

Lewis married **Elizabeth LAUDERDALE** daughter of William LAUDERDALE about 1750 in, Culpepper County, Virginia. Elizabeth was born about 1730 in, Augusta County, Virginia. She died about 1805.

Lauderdales are descended from James Maitland Lauderdale, the Emigrant, who settled in Pennsylvania around 1714. He is thought to have moved from southwest Scotland, where the Lauderdale name is known in the 18th century, to Northern Ireland and thence to North America. See History of the Lauderdale in America Heritage, 1998, Clint Lauderdale, <mailto:clarlen@aol.com>

We don't know from whom James Lauderdale, the Emigrant was descended, and he made no claims to be descended from the Earls of Lauderdale. Equally, he was firm in his assertion that he was a Maitland by origin, and this is the tradition which he handed down to his children and grandchildren and which was formally recorded by James Shelby Lauderdale in 1880. This refers to a meeting between his uncle Sam, and Dr David Lauderdale who met in 1830, and discovered that they shared a common family tradition. Another Lauderdale from New York was met in 1880 in St Louis with a similar tale.

Lauderdale as a family name, not connected with the title, first appears in the Scottish parish records in Galloway in the early 18th century with the birth of Jean Lauderdale in 1737, the daughter of James Lauderdale at Beith, Ayr.

Maitlands have lived in or been connected with Galloway since 1360, and our understanding of James the Emigrant is that he came from that part of Scotland, so the combination of geography, name and his family tradition makes it almost certain that he was a Maitland by origin, and as such, related by blood to the Earls of Lauderdale, but not descended from them.

Elizabeth, who appears in the records of Washington County in 1797 as "old and infirm" and gave power of attorney to "my son-in-law Moses Foley." She died about 1803, intestate. Appraisal of there estate was presented to the court by Zachariah Green.

2. **Lewis J. GREEN Jr.** (Lewis J.) was born on 5 May 1751 in Dinwiddie County, Virginia. He died after 10 Jun 1835 in Callaway, Harlan County, Kentucky. He was buried in Kirby Cemetery, Callaway, Bell County, Kentucky.

A Lewis Green was listed in 1790 and 1795 Russell Co., Virginia Personal Property Tax List. Upper District

Lewis, Jr. was a Revolutionary War Veteran from Virginia. He was one of the first settlers on the Cumberland River. He lived in what is now Calloway, Bell Co., Kentucky. He was buried at what used to be Old Meeting House Branch, now Callaway. During US119 construction in 1960 in the Calloway area, his grave was relocated on land which belonged to John Matt Pursiful, just outside of the private cemetery known as Newt Creek Cemetery. He had been in Kentucky with some of Daniel Boone's scouting parties, and returned there as a surveyor and acquired the property from the top of Pine Mountain

to the Cumberland River. Tan Yard Hill was part of his property and got its name from the tanning vats used in curing animal skins. He was an Indian spy and Scout.

"DECLARATION

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the 7th of June 1832-State of Kentucky, county of Harlan, on this 4th of November 1833, personally appeared before the undersigned and acting Justice of the Peace for Harlan County, Lewis Green a resident of the Cumberland River; in the County of Harlan, and the State of Kentucky age 82 years the 5th of May last, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make this following declaration, in order to benefit of the promissory made by the act of Congress..June 7, 1832, that I enlisted in the spring of 1776, as well as I remember, in the county of Russell and state of Virginia on the Clinch River, about nine miles from the county seat, for and during the Revolutionary War, under John Blakeman, William Moore; Lieutenant Joseph Moore; brother of William Ensign, Isaac Shelby.

I was forted at Blakeman's Fort on the Clinch River. Afterwards I was forted at Duncan's Fort also, about ten miles higher up on the Clinch River.

Our constant business was to guard the frontier from the Indians. I can give no distinct history of my service for it was one continual employment from these forts to scout the surrounding country, and spy out the hiding places of the Indians, and keep them from annoying the frontier settlement. I served seven years, and was discharged when the war was over, which was in 1783.

I have no record of my age as I have lost my discharge. I need a written discharge for my services in the Revolutionary War, signed by Shelby.

I never was in a general battle, but many of the times, when in the discharge of my duties as a spy in reconnoitering the surrounding country, that my fellow soldiers, when least expecting it, fell by my side.

I do not know of any soldiers by whom I could prove my service. If Congress had passed this law a few years earlier, I could have found witnesses a plenty, but now, if any with whom I served are living, it is unknown to me.

After my enlistment, I served under different captains, but I remember none other than Shelby.

I was living in Russell County, Virginia when I enlisted in the Revolutionary War.

I am known to Rev. James Hall, Jacob Saylor, Parker Howard, William Howard, and many others who would testify to my character for veracity and their belief of my services as a soldier of the Revolutionary War.

I hereby relinquish my claim to a pension or assuming accept the payment, and declare

that my name is not on the pension roll or agency of any state --- I further declare that from old age and bodily infirmity, I am not able to travel to the court house, a distance of seventeen miles, from where I live.

Sworn to and submitted the day and year aforesaid. (Signed) Lewis Green

We James Hall a clergyman residing in Harlan County, Kentucky, about two miles from the above applicant and William D. Green, residing in the same county and state hereby certify that we are well acquainted with Lewis Green, having known him twenty-one years, who has submitted and sworn to the above declaration that we believe him to be eighty two years of age-that he is reputed and believed in the neighborhood where he resides; to have been a soldier in the Revolutionary War, and that we concede in that opinion.

And I do hereby declare my opinion, that after the investigation of the matter and after putting this interrogation prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary War soldier, and served as he states, and that from bodily infirmity, he is unable to attend court, being a distance of seventeen miles--and further certify that James Hall who has signed the foregoing certificate is a clergyman of my own knowledge, and that he together with William Green (Article ends)"

6. **James GREEN Sr.** (Lewis J.) was born in 1757 in Virginia. He died on 31 Dec 1782 in Wise County, Virginia. He was buried in A Hollow Chestnut Tree.

Robert Kilgore, husband of Winnie Clayton, was killed in what is now Wise Co., Virginia at The Pound at a place called Warrior's Camp. Robert and Winnie lived along the Clinch River in what is now Scott Co., Virginia, then Russell County. His property directly bordered that of his brother Charles and was also located near that of Partrick

Porter also of Orange Co., North Carolina. Several of the families who settled this section of Scott Co. were originally Orange Co. natives.

On December 31, 1782, James Green, husband of Jane Porter, and Robert Kilgore, Sr. left their hunting camp at the mouth of Indian Creek and Pound River and crossed a ridge heading toward Kentucky. They left a man by the name of McKinney in the camp. Two gunshots were heard by McKinney, followed by the unearthly yells of Indians. Before McKinney could grab his gun, he saw Robert Kilgore running for his life toward the encampment, shouting, "Run McKinney, leave all, save yourself!"

McKinney didn't wait to be told a second time. As he reached the crest of the ridge, he looked back, to see James Green fall, closely pursued by Mingo. Green sprang up, grabbed out his hunting knife, but before the Indians reached him he collapsed. As the sun was sinking, McKinney reached Fort Blackmore.

By first light of the following day, the militia was on its way far up Stoney Creek, reaching the hunters encampment long before sunrise on January 1, 1783. No Indians could be found, but the camp had been pillaged. Next morning, they found the scalped remains of Robert Kilgore and a few hundred yards away, the body of James Green, with an Indian arrowhead in his right eye. The bodies were buried in a hollow chestnut tree on the north bank of the Pound River, a short distance above the mouth of Indian Creek.

There is no information on what happened to Winnie Clayton Kilgore after the death of Robert. It is believed she remarried, probably in Russell Co., Virginia, unfortunately marriage register burned in a fire during the late 1800s. Family legend says she moved to Indiana with her oldest son Charles and died there, but there is no proof.

A Lewis Green is listed as #167 (assuming son of Zachariah Sr.). In Lewis's House there was this listing: 1 male 6-10, 2 males 11-15, 1 male 31-40, 1 female 0-5, 3 females 6-10, 1 female 11-15, 1 female 21-30

BIOGRAPHY: This story is contributed by Dan Williams, a Green descendant. It is part of the "oral history" that he grew up hearing as a child in the 1920's and 30's. This story and other information was published in 1994 in a book that Dan wrote on the Green and LeForce families of Harlan/Bell County.

Zach was out on Pine Mountain near present day Pineville hunting turkeys & shot a brace, which he put in his sack. Indians hearing the shots started hunting Zach. Zach ran around Pine Mountain, Grandfather naming all the creeks & branches as he ran. finally he doubled back and started to run over the trail where the Indians had first jumped him. He continued along this trail in the same direction as before until he came to a hollow tree just off the trail. Here he jumped off the trail into the tree, hoping the Indians would continue on down the trail for a

ways, and in this way make his escape.

To Zach's surprise there was a bear in the hollow tree, deep in his winter's sleep. Zach quickly got his knife into the bear's heart, and this caused the bear to wake up, and more that a bit angry. Man and bear came out of the hollow tree in a rush. The bear, now awake, was inflicting terrible wounds on Zach. He had Zach's head in his mouth and was shaking him like a rag doll. Suddenly the bear dropped dead, and Zach lay beside him, to all appearances also dead.

The Indians came upon the scene about the time Zach and bear came out of the tree, and watched the fight as it raged. The Indians built a rack and placed Zach, his gun and turkeys on the Rack. They made a large fire and started to roast pieces of the bear after first eating the raw heart of the bear. They began to chant and praise Zach as a mighty hunter, a great warrior who could kill a bear with only a knife.

Zach came to himself on the rack. He was bleeding from deep claw wounds on his chest and arms, and teeth wounds on his head. He put turkey feathers on his wounds to stop the bleeding. After he gathered his strenght he loaded his gun and jumped down among the feasting Indians, with the intentions of surprising them and making a run for it. Before he could discharge his weapon the Indians were gone, sure that Zach was a man returned from the spirit world to avenge himself on them. They left the Cumberland not to return for several hunting seasons

believing that Zach was waiting for them. Zach ate bear meat for several days until he

got strong enough to return to camp, but when he got there his companions had left believing that the Indians had got him and were now hunting them.

After that the Indians called Zach the Turkey Man, because when he jumped from the rack he covered with feathers and they thought he had flown down from heaven to avenge himself on them. My Grandfather, also

believed that when his wounds healed the feathers were under his skin, where they could be seen, and that for years the feathers would cause festers, and be expelled.

Grandma Virginia Green Risner gave the following list of relationships: Josiah Hoskins, the father of Henry Risner; Lish Green, father of Katie Risner, Fielding Green, and Sallie Risner. Perhaps Lish reared Fielding Green.

Sallie Risner married a Burns and made her home on Straight Creek. Fielding Green married Easter GREEN and made his home on Yellow Creek, and the place is still known as the Fielding Green home. 


SOME DESCENDANTS OF LEWIS GREEN, SR. AS RECORDED BY LUCY GREEN WHITE

Lewis Green, Sr. has had many descendants born in Elliott County. Many still live here. He was born about 1724, served in the French and Indian War, and came to Porter's Fort in present day Scott County, Virginia about 1772. He died October 1784 near Glasgow, Kentucky while on his way to Nashville, Tennessee. His children were Zachariah, Lewis, Jr., James, Sr., Thomas, Sarah, Nancy who married Peter Hutchinson, Sr., and they still have descendants in Elliott and Morgan Counties, John and Jesse.

James Green, Sr., born about 1757, was killed by Chief Bengé while on a hunting trip near what is now Pound, Virginia. He was an early settler in present day Scott County, and was married to Jane Porter Born 9 September 1761, died 25 September 1842, daughter of Patrick Porter and Susannah Walker.

James Green, Jr., only child of James, Sr. and Jane, born in Washington County, Virginia 12 February 1783, died 6 October 1851; married Delcena Stallard born 1781, died 1842, daughter of Samuel Stallard and Jael Duncan. Their children were Mary, Susan married James Claiborne White, Robert Kilgore married Marinda Workman, Eliza Jane, "Fiddler" James, William Wellington, Sr., Jailey, Martin Wood and Almeda. Susan Green and James Claiborne White and Robert Kilgore Green and Marinda Workman were great grandparents of my husband Bert White.

I was born October 30, 1897, Amanda White, on White's Creek in Elliott County, fifth child of James Franklin White and wife, Missouri Alice (Green). (See brother Bert Leston White's article, this publication.) When I was fifteen our family moved to a farm on Little Sandy River located opposite mouth of Newcombe Creek. Pappaw was also a merchant.

Once, on a horseback errand to bring my older brother home from attending school at Sandy Hook, we met a young man pushing a bicycle up the rough, rutted "Boggs" hill. Brother Estill said he was "Code" Greene, from the "Normal" school at Sandy Hook. "Normal" school was advanced study (replaced by "High School")! I soon attended that school, took the examination required for a teacher's certificate, taught at Cliffside and Bruin country schools and became close friends with "Code" Greene. "Normal" school teachers of our time were Mistrs Hatfield, Chandler, Roscoe Ferguson and principal Cam Holbrook.

William Cody Greene, born June 14, 1896, was a first year dental college student when we married 26th of December,

We made our first home on Walnut Street in Louisville, and Clarice Elaine, our first child, was born there December 14, 1917. After Code graduated from University of Louisville Dental College, May 1919, he started his dental practice in Sandy Hook. Herbert Delmaine was

born July 3, 1919, at my parents home. John Franklin was born September 3, 1921, in Sandy Hook and William Cody, Jr. was born in Belle City in our first "new" home, which was directly across the road from the Oscar and Lula Bays family home. They were our close good neighbors for so many years and their home still stands. Ours was where the I.G.A. now is. Ruth Jeannine also was born in Belle City, November 18, 1935.

After developing arthritis in his hands, Code was forced to retire from practice February 1935. He then went into the retail grocery business. He built the "Greene" building in Sandy Hook and the I.G.A. - Conley Electric building in Belle City. He was county Democratic Chairman for many years, and probably because of being an orphan in childhood and having had a "hard way to go", he was always compassionate toward the poor. He died of a heart attack February 11, 1966.

Elaine married Joseph Woodrow Conley and they raised their family in Belle City. They have operated Conley Electric Hardware for the past thirty-four years.

Delmaine married Sadie Thornberry. They raised their family in Belle City and Owingsville, he also graduated from University of Louisville Dental College, as his father had and later his son, Herbert did. Delmaine died September 30, 1982, because of renal failure and a heart attack. He served in the Army in the Pacific during WW II.

John Franklin married Georgia Hale in Louisville, graduated from University of Louisville School of Medicine. After tour of duty in the Navy (Pacific Theatre), he practiced medicine in Elliott County from

1946 until he retired completely on his birthday, 1984, (forty years after graduation.)

William Cody, Jr. married Lois Wheeler, graduated from the same dental school and has practiced dentistry here steadily since his tour in the Army Dental Corp.

Ruth Jeannine married Wendell Pennington, a radio-television technician. After his tour of duty in the Army Signal Corps in Canal Zone, they returned to Belle City. They were divorced and Jeannine has since married Ishmael Howard. Her daughter, Winnie Sue (Gevedon), died of an incurable renal disease in 1972.

Robert Jan was born 1938, married Betty Lou Mayse and they had two children, Robert Allen and Judith Annette. Jan was killed in an automobile accident 1974. Betty died of a heart attack. Robert Allen died in an automobile-motorcycle accident. Judith Annette (Boggs) lives here in Elliott County with her husband and son.

Now, at age eighty-seven, I am not real active, but do some house and garden work, sew, read a lot, and do my own shopping. I feel I have much to be grateful to the Lord for, in my life.

Code and I raised and educated our children quite well, we thought. Among our children and grandchildren, we have had five teachers, two musicians, a merchant, a construction foreman, a social worker, a medical laboratory technician, five dentists, five medical doctors and one granddaughter is in nurse training now.





MORE ABOUT AMANDA GREENE'S MATERNAL ANCESTORS

Amanda Greene's mother was Missouri Alice White, born May 20, 1869, in Kentucky. She was a daughter of David Crockett Green (born Virginia, January 18, 1843) and his wife Amanda Boggs Green.

David Crockett Green was the fifth of six children born to Robert Kilgore Green (born Virginia, June, 1811) and wife Merinda Workman Green (born Virginia, 1819). Robert Kilgore Green was a son of James Green, Jr., and great grandson of Lewis Green of Virginia and Tennessee. He was a pioneer Virginian, school teacher, and his six children were born there. Later, he and his family moved to

Kentucky, and settled on the eastern side of lower Newcombe Creek. The oldest son, Francis Marion, returned to Virginia; James Madison (born February 12, 1836) married Mary Elizabeth Mason; Mary Jane (born April 18, 1839) married Parish Brickey; William Martin (born August 24, 1840) married Nancy Virginia Green; and Crockett (named above); Sena Elizabeth (born December 16, 1845) married Benton Hutchinson. Great, great, grandfather, Robert Kilgore Green was well known for his kindness and deep religious devotion and writings. He died September 2, 1875, but his wife, Merinda, lived until May 24, 1899. Both are buried near what is now the Emory Stephens home. David Crockett Green died October 30, 1928. He and wife Amanda are buried in the White Cemetery on Little Sandy River. *Submitted by John Franklin Greene*

MORE ABOUT THE ANCESTORS OF WILLIAM CODY GREENE, SR.

About 1857, Granville Bumgardner (born Virginia 1824) and wife Mary (Vaughn?) moved with their children (probably four) from Virginia to the northern cliff of Laurel Creek in northern Morgan County, Kentucky. That site, now a part of Elliott County, has since been owned by the John Howard family and at present by Addie Dehart.

Granville was a carpenter and builder of log homes. His youngest son, Stewart, was killed in the "Rowan County Trouble." Youngest daughter Virginia (Margaret Virginia) married a Jenkins. They had two daughters, Lucinda and Mariah. Granville's oldest son, Henry F. was listed as eight years of age in the 1860 Morgan County Census, but in no later census. The oldest child, Emily (born in Virginia 1851) married Stephen Porter (also born in Virginia, 1851) and they had about fourteen children, the second oldest being Belle. Emily (Bumgardner) Porter died in 1921. Her father had died in 1910. Stephen Porter died in 1931. All three (Granville, daughter Emily, and Emily's husband, Stephen Porter) are buried in the Bent Cemetery, Bryant, Wisconsin.

Olive Belle Porter (born Kentucky 1875) married John Greene (born in Kentucky

(1875), the third child of William Wellington "Wag" Greene, Jr. He was a merchant and they lived in Sandy Hook, then at Soldier, KY, where he died at the age of thirty years, due to typhoid fever. He left his widow, Olive, with four young children (Jobe, William Cody, Herbert and Maxine.) Jobe and Code (then 10 and 8 years of age) went to live with their grandfather, "Wag" Green. Olive remarried to Joe Rob Evans and they, with Herbert and Maxine, lived also on Bruin.

Jobe and Herbert studied law. Maxine married Jobe's close Army friend of WW I, Lawrence Hearn. Herbert died at age fifty-one, due to a heart attack.

William Cody studied dentistry, married Amanda Suzan White (See her story, this publication). He died at age sixty-nine years.

FOOTNOTE: About 1847, Granville Bumgardner's older brother Johnny (born Virginia 1814) wife Sarah and their six children moved from Virginia to the northern Cliff of Laurel Creek on what is now the Orville Dehart farm. They had three more children, born in Kentucky. Johnny was a confederate sympathizer. He and his sons were considered to be guerrillas by the Union and Home Guard forces. In a battle, August 1, 1863, at Johnny Bumgardner's home, men were killed on both sides. Robert, the youngest son was wounded, but survived, and later told a young neighbor, who recently relayed it to me, that he lost his father, Johnny, and two older brothers in the fight. (He may

have meant during the Civil War, since it is believed by some that the William Bumgardner who, with a McMillan, was ambushed by Union forces while crossing a foot-log across Bruin Creek, was Johnny Bumgardner's William.) *Submitted by John Frank Greene*

DR. WILLIAM CODY GREENE, JR. AND LOIS WHEELER GREENE

Dr. Greene, affectionately known as Bill was born in Elliott Co. on April 2, 1928 the fourth child of Dr. William Cody Greene, Sr. and Amanda Susan White Greene.

Lois was born in Elliott Co. on July 11, 1930 the fifth child of Claude V. Wheeler and Mabel Rice Wheeler.

Bill and I lived a distance of six miles but never met until we were introduced by his sister-in-law, Georga Greene, at a wedding on July 4, 1948. I was soloist and she pianist. We were married on June 14, 1949 at the Methodist Church in Sandy Hook, Ky. by the Rev. Charley Vansant.

We lived in Louisville, Ky. while Bill completed his school. Bill graduated from the University of Louisville Dental School in 1950 with highest honors and the youngest in his class. After graduation we came to Sandy Hook where he began his dental practice with his father. After about three years his father retired and started a grocery business now known as Elliott County I. G. A. In 1955 Bill's brother Dalmaine began his dental practice here. They worked together for about one year, then Bill entered military service. He served with the rank of Captain at Murphy Army Hospital in Waltham, Mass., for a year and one half. Then to Fort Campbell, Ky for six months. Upon completion of military service we returned to Sandy Hook where Bill is in active dental practice today.

Lois attended grade school in a one room school at Isonville, Ky. S. L. GREEN STORE

This is the S. L. Green General Merchandise Store, as it appeared in the early 1900's, a time before the telephone and the automobile.

Most anything that farmers needed could be purchased here. Things like Birdsell wagons, buggies and farm machinery. They stocked caskets, trimmings for homemade caskets, cooking utensils, fertilizer, seeds, groceries, notions and

many other things.

Just across the road from the store was a shop-house where they did repairs on farm tools, shod horses, a mill to grind turns of corn into meal, and a sawmill to saw lumber.

Not only were all these things available, but there in the middle of the room was the traditional "pot bellied stove" with homemade chairs all around to seat the daily gathering of farmers who had finished harvesting their crop and could now "swap yarns" or plan next year's crop, during the remaining months of winter until planting time again in the spring.

On the second floor of the building, there was a Masonic Lodge Hall, where the Masons and Oddfellows met monthly. In the back of the store was located the Ibox post office. Truly a "Community Center" in this Country General Merchandise Store, wouldn't you say? *Submitted by: Mar. Ellen Henson*





Molly was a practical woman, the perfect complement to Sherman the dreamer. She was a talented seamstress who (along with sister Laura) had been taught the art of making buttonholes as little girls by their grandmother Edy Howard Hunter. HUTCHINSONS OF ELK FORK

Many people have researched and much has been written about the Hutchinsons. Published books can be ordered from numerous authors and some are readily available in genealogical libraries. The Hutchinsons are interspersed with notable people who made a name for themselves or simply stood up for what they believed in. Anne Hutchinson is in our American history books; Andrew Jackson, our 7th President of the United States (1829-1837), whose mother was Elizabeth Hutchinson of Northern Ireland; James Hutchinson who left Kentucky for Kansas and, supposedly, Hutchinson, Kansas is named for him; and the list goes on.

I've read many accounts of ancestry; i.e., Scotch-Irish, Dutch, Pa. Dutch, Quakers, Shakers, French Huguenots, English, etc., have studied the migration patterns, talked with historians

and other genealogists, and I remain firmly convinced that the Hutchinsons were here from the very early years of our country, were numerous, staunch in their beliefs, and steadfast in their sacrifice for freedom and independence. These traits are ever present today.

In researching, I have been able to come up with a crest but no tartan as I have been told the Hutchinsons have. In Bain's, The Clans and Tartans of Scotland, the Hutchinson families are allied to clan MacDonald and they have at least six tartans, all are combinations of red and green except the hunting tartan of MacDonald of the Isles.

The Hutchinsons of Elliott and Morgan Counties are descendants of James (John) P. Hutchinson, b 1670. Some say his wife was Hannah Helton, others say Sara Hutton. My cousin, Edna Barker Hutchinson Offenbacher, had verified Sara Hutton and much of the following lineage is hers. She had worked for several years on the Hutchinson line before I became involved and always said she was going to publish the lineage and the numerous family stories that she had always been told.

James P. Hutchinson and his wife are believed to have been born in Northern Ireland and came to America in the early 1700s.



Family tradition has it that James Harve's family and Betty's family were at the "Salt Licks" getting salt to cure their meat when he saw her at a distance. He thought she was the "prettiest little thing" he'd ever seen with "coal black hair" and beautiful eyes. Supposedly, he made up his mind then and there to make her his bride. In a short time, he did. They lived on Elk Fork where Great Grandpa had quite a bit of land, some say 1000 acres plus. He belonged to the Masons and was very active and proud of the organization. His tombstone reflects that. James Harve always kept foxhounds and loved to run them. People have told me that he always rode a big, black stallion and would travel from place to place, riding him, to breed mares. If he happened to imbibe, the story goes that he could lie down anywhere and his stallion would never leave his side, tied or not.

Great grandpa apprenticed in a leather shop in Wilmington, NC, for about 10 years, where he learned to make shoes. The Hutchinson saddle, of course, is still known of in Eastern KY, and according to my mother, anyone who rode knew immediately if they were on a Hutchinson saddle. She said people came from all over to buy them.

Elizabeth "Betty" Mason Hutchinson, b 13 Nov 1837, was the daughter of Thomas Jefferson Mason and Susan Green White. Her grandparents were James Mason and Sally Todd, and James Green, Jr. and Dulecena Stallard. From all accounts, she must have been a wonderful woman and very much in love with her husband. While great grandpa was in the Civil War, she kept the farm going and worked from sunup to sundown. It has been said that great grandpa's "Union" suit was still in the old house when it was torn down. Great grandma Betty couldn't stand to part with it.

When Morgan's Raiders came through Elk Fork during the turbulent times after the Civil War, they stopped at James Harve and Betty's taking their horses and anything else they could. They took great grandpa and his beloved stallion with one of his "trained" dogs following behind. Harve had taught this dog to take the horse's bridle in his mouth and lead the horse. Family tradition has it that James Harve was tied to a tree

while Morgan's Raiders were around a campfire eating and drinking. Sometime during the night, James Harve worked the ropes loose, signaled his dog that went and got his horse, slipped away in the late night hours because he was certain they would end up killing him when they found out which side of the war he had been on. Until the day great grandma Betty died, people knew to never mistreat a dog in her presence. It has even been said she would get on you if you tried to run one off a porch.

My mother always said Uncle Trav was the best looking man she had ever seen and evidently great aunt Sues thought so too. He was fifteen years older and her teacher. Family tradition tells of how they had to sneak to see each other and leave letters in the hollow of an old tree. Aunt Sues was a very pretty young woman and their wedding photo shows a very striking couple with

five children. On 24 Nov 1907, Travis Barker's arm was amputated and once it was healed, he went right on working. Great aunt Sues and Uncle Trav had a short marriage with him dying 3 Sep 1919. Aunt Sues had nineteen years with the man she loved, but they were enough to last a lifetime.

Great grandma Betty smoked a corn cob pipe right up until she died. She lived to be the oldest woman in Elliott Co. at the time of her death, 29 Aug 1936. I can remember many years ago seeing a newspaper clipping at my grandpa's telling of her death. Martha Hutchinson Wright was seventy-seven years old when I was born and she was the only grandparent I ever knew. Many weeks we made daily trips to Middle Fork to feed her chickens so she wouldn't have to get rid of them. My dad was always doing something special for her. Some of my fondest memories are of quiet times in her "lower room" when she would tell of the past and show me letters tied in ribbons with old, old stamps on them since I was into collecting stamps. Also, she had several tinprints and she would tell me each name and something about each person. I just simply thought she would always be around so I did not write any of it down and today I truly regret it. She always had candy hidden in her dresser drawers and if almost out, would let me walk up to Wilson Skaggs' store for a nickel's worth of candy. Wilson always filled my "poke" to overflowing. Grandma wasn't a very big woman, hard of hearing, thin hair, and little tiny black rimmed glasses. She wore long print dresses that my mom usually made her and typical "Granny" shoes. She had a black snake in her cellar that she wouldn't let anyone bother so most of the time she had to make her own trips to get the stored food. I still remember vividly her falling on ice at Wilson Skaggs' and later, it was learned that she had broken her hip. She stayed with us for some time in our front bedroom and I would sit on a cane bottom chair by her bed and talk. I don't remember her complaining but Mom always said Ma was in horrible pain. I told Grandma that when I got big, I was going to help people like her. At the time I was thinking of being a doctor. Aunt Sabrie and Uncle Roy were just right across the road and it was made up that if we needed help or something was wrong we would put a white sheet across the porch bannisters. After some debate, Grandma was taken to Huntington by ambulance and later, moved to the farm where we took turns taking care of her. On occasions she would talk of "Pap" or something that had happened long ago; however, it was as if she knew she didn't have long. She wanted to die at home and did not want to be embalmed. Both wishes were honored. On 7 Apr 1955, Grandma drew her last breath and I had my first experience with a human death and deep, profound, heartrending grief. As my mother aged, she looked so much like Grandma, acted like her, walked like her, and now, I am discovering that I am becoming like them, especially attitude and old fashioned values. The older I get, the smarter they become.

Many Hutchinsons still live in Elliott and Morgan Counties but most of us have moved other places for one reason or another. Regardless, we are bonded for eternity. And, to the memory of Edna Barker Hutchinson Offenbacher, this story is dedicated. She and I shared a love for our Hutchinson history, families, traditions and Kentucky. Submitted by: Sue H. ARCHIBALD ISON

Archibald Ison (ca 1780 - 22 Feb 1855) came to eastern KY in the early 1800s. He appeared in the 1810 Clay Co. KY Census as Arch Isham and the 1820 Floyd Co. Census. He migrated from Scott Co. VA and many of his family remained there, including his parents, Charles and Elizabeth Ison.

Archibald married Mary Gilliam about 1800.

land. 250 acres each and drew numbers where their share would fall. My father Newton got the section the log cabin was on. Then he and Uncle Merdith swapped.

My father, Newton Bougess Gillum, married Druzella Stephens around 1874. Unto them was born 11 children: (1) James Merdith Gillum (4 Aug 1875 - 23 May 1943); (2) Pleasant Gillum (3 Aug 1877); (3) Marion Gillum (31 Aug 1879); (4) John Gillum (14 Feb 1882); (5) Charity Gillum (11 Feb 1884); (6) Eliza Gillum (15 Apr 1886); (7) Charlie Gillum (27 Mar 1888); (8) Richard Gillum (26 Apr 1890); (9) David Gillum (14 Dec 1892); (10) Missouri Elizabeth Gillum (1 July 1894); (11) Newton (N.B.) Gillum, Jr. (26 Sep 1898).

Newton Bougess Gillum married Susa I. McBrayer, 30 Aug 1905. She was born 28 Nov 1877. Unto them was born 8 children. My father was 49 years old, my mother (Susan) was 28 years old: (1) Arthur Gillum (6 June 1906); (2) Ruth Gillum (3 Dec 1907); (3) Edward Gillum (26 Nov 1909); (4) Amanda Gillum (21 Feb 1912); (5) Barbara Gillum (Twin) (18 Apr 1914); (6) Marie Gillum (Twin) (18 Apr 1914); (7) Henry Gillum (14 June 1916); (8) Ida Gillum (5 Nov 1918).

Education on school was not known in these parts, but around 1880, they built a one-room school in that part and my father enrolled along with his 2 sons, James M. and Pleasant. He visited the county seat where they read off names of teachers. No Gillum's name there. He was determined and encouraged his children to become teachers. James M. Gillum taught school 15 years. Pleasant had bad eyes, couldn't study well and didn't teach. Marion taught school and also singing school. Years later father, Newton, was elected truant officer of Elliott Co. KY schools. He visited the school on horseback, checking the absent ones and encouraging them to get an education. He had a good sense of humor and made speeches, and was loved by all who knew him.

It was the first tree known in these parts! One Christmas we had a community Christmas tree, the school room was decorated with holly, which grew wild and plentiful in the hills. My father was Santa Claus, wore a suit my mother made. The tree was pine and decorated with popcorn and colored paper. The parents brought presents and father gave them out to the children.

Not many years after Newton and Druzella married, he built a nice big house, also a general merchandise store. In years between 1911-1914, two of my brothers, Marion and Richard, took their families and moved to Phoenix, Arizona. Father's health wasn't good. He sold the store to David Davis during World War I, 1917. Father went to visit the boys in Arizona. It took him 4 days by train. The train stopped in El Paso, Texas. As father stepped out to see the standing Army, out of the crowd a voice said, "Hello Uncle Newt". Father was thrilled! The boy was Dewey Hannah, a neighbor boy from Kentucky. Father asked the boys to sing him a song, and they sang 2 songs. He said it was beautiful. Other soldier boys wrote to my father. One was Vermont Stapleton.

When my father owned his store, the first general store in these parts, he had to go many miles with an ox team, 16 miles one way, to restock his store. It was hard to travel in winter and spring, dirt roads, mud and snow. He owned the first mule team and had an experienced driver, John Stephens, a nephew of Druzella. The last mule team was Bob and Barney. Uncle Merdith also drove for father. The first Post Office was in my father's store and he was first Postmaster. It was called "Burke, KY" and still existed until a few years ago, still owned and operated by a grandson, John Gillum, Jr. Albert Gillum owns the old homeplace and has a nice brick home there.

Father Newton died 11 August 1923. Aunt Virginia married Josh Sloan and they had 6 children: Charity Sloan, Robert Sloan, Minnie Sloan, Ira

Sloan, Tom Sloan and John Sloan. Aunt Virginia was born 1853. After her husband died, she moved to Washington State in 1906. Aunt Charlotte married Tom Stapleton and they had 12 children: William Stapleton, Charity Stapleton, Ester Stapleton, Silas Stapleton, James Stapleton, Francis Stapleton, Susan Stapleton, John Stapleton, Jane Stapleton, Missouri Stapleton, Jasper Stapleton and Alma Stapleton.

Uncle Merdith married Caroline Stephens (Druzella's sister). They had 5 children: John Gillum, Newton Gillum, Bill Gillum, Hugh Gillum and Druzy Gillum.

Aunt Francis married Green Stephens. They had 2 boys, James Stephens and Newton Stephens.



Our father was Elijah O. Green (Lige) and he was the son of the late David C. and Amanda Boggs Green. He was born March 13, 1880, in Elliott County. He departed this life, July 16, 1961. He was 81 years, 4 months and 3 days old. He had a host of brothers and sisters, which I am sure will be written about in this book.

Our mother was Daisy Myrtle Duvall Green, born August 2, 1882, in Elliott County, the daughter of the late James Monroe Duvall and Sue Green Duvall. There were three girls and two boys in this family. Mom departed this life February 11, 1965, at the home of a daughter, Idell Green Wheeler, at Green, Kentucky. She was 82 years old.

From this marriage are the following children: Virgil Homer Green, wife Bethel Fraley Green (deceased) - children - Ruby Green Phillips, Daisy LeaDale Green Stapleton, Donna Sue Green Hartley, a host of grandchildren and great-grandchildren; Missouri Dale Green (deceased 1918, age 9); Dixie Lenora (Lee) Green Holbrook, married Harvey Lewis Holbrook - children - Hazel Lucille Holbrook Hawkins, Daisy Lee Holbrook Howard, Judith Idell Holbrook Burke, Harvey Lewis Holbrook, Jr., and Clay Green Holbrook. I am sure that a lot of people think, because of the years between us, that we are not a close family; but on the contrary, we are very, very close. We have always felt loved and shared our love, as taught by our parents, Lige and Daisy Green.

Our parents fell in love, as we could say "Head over Heels". Mom's mother didn't approve of the love our parents shared. She thought everyone should have a business or enough money to go into business. After our Dad thought everything over, he came to Mom and said, "Daisy, I am enlisting in the Army (Spanish American) and will be gone

seven years, maybe longer. I won't be home or even have a day off. I will save every penny. I love you and you love me, but we won't make a promise to each

other. You date and have fun. I will date also. When I come home after seven years, if you are single, and I am single, and we still love each other, we will be married." So that was the way it was.

Our Dad was discharged with the highest of honors, September 25 (or 27), 1904. Their love had grown stronger and December 29, 1904, they were married. Dad said then that Mom was the prettiest woman he had ever seen. When he died in 1961, a couple of hours or so before, he could only whisper. He held Mom's hand and said, "pretty in the world." Mom said, "you, too, don't leave me!" Jack Green, Dixie Holbrook and myself were close by. My husband, Clay, was with us also. Our brother, Virgil H. Green, hadn't gotten to the hospital, where Dad died at the VA Hospital in Huntington, West Virginia.

When our Dad enlisted in the Army, his salary was \$12.00 a month, then it raised to \$15.00 per month, the last four years. James Monroe Duvall, our granddad, told Dad he could have the farm where we (Clay & Idell) lived for \$1500.00, from Bert White's line, who now owns it, to the water falls straight down from Tater Knob where the falls of water come over. At that time it was 85 acres, more or less, now it is less, for Grayson Lake took a lot of acres. Well anyway, Dad lacked \$500.00 having cash to pay, plus building a house and again he came to a decision, and told Mom, "I am going to Cranston, Wisconsin, to get a job in the log-woods and am only taking enough money for train fare." When he stepped off the train, snow was kneedeep. He only had on slippers and cotton pants. He sent for Mom. When Dad came back from Wisconsin, he had cash enough to pay for the land and enough to start building a house. Dad's motto was and what he told us was, "If you don't have the money to pay, then you don't need it." That still stays with me. Our Dad was the most wonderful man ever born.

Dad finished teaching two schools for a brother and finished a term as Elliott County Sheriff for a brother. He was also Postmaster, or Acting Postmaster, for

twenty years at Green Post Office and Chairman of the Elliott County P.M.A.. USDA, now known as the ASCS Office.

We never heard Mom speak bad things or thoughts of anyone. She always said, "There is some good in everyone. If you want to look deep enough to find it, and nothing will rub off on you unless you want it to," which I sure found to be true. Our Mom was good, honest, down to earth, a warm person and we still miss them very much.

Before the death of our brother, Dale, he and our brother, Virgil, were close, but so different, our parents told us. If Dale found a crippled bird or bug, or anything, he would try to nurse it back to normal, and if they died, Virgil would get the box and bird and dangle it in front of Dale, saying more preaching is needed. Dale never told on him, but sometimes Dad would catch Virgil, and I guess the fur flew. When they both got straw hats in the spring, Virgil would tear Dale's to pieces, flying it into the air like a kite and keep his new. Dad said there was a bond between Virgil and Dale (deceased) that could only be broken by death.

Talking about the farm where we now live, if it could sprout knives, you couldn't haul them in a trailer where Dixie Lee was always whittling and cutting names in the trees and digging mayapple root for a penny, from our late uncle Jim White. Mom tried to mold Dixie into doing housework and I would follow Dad and Virgil to the field. Mom decided to make a change when Dixie hid the dirty dishes in the oven and would be gone before Mom knew it, so Mom molded me into her housekeeper, and I mean molded. After that, Virgil was my one and only playmate, until he married. Then, when our youngest brother, Jack, came along, guess I was like an old mother hen and still am. Our cousin, Rhett Green Brown and Hazel Green Gray stayed with us, when I was very little. I wanted Hazel and Virgil, no one else, to care for me.

We had, and still have, a warm loving family, though sometimes it is a long time between visits. When a Green sees his loved ones and friends, then he's ready to go home.

Their children were known to be: Levi, George, Robert, Joel b. abt. 1785, John, Jr., b. abt. 1787, Reuben b. 9-06-1799, Colby, b. 1801, Sally b. 1793, Polly b. 1780, also a son and two daughter not identified.

Of these children, George, Levi and Robert migrated to, and settled in, Eastern Kentucky about 1820. All the others were known to have settled in parts of North Carolina. In fact, SPARKS, North Carolina was named for the same Sparks'.

said John and Sarah (Shores) Sparks, and their descendants. The home place was located at SARAH, KY, Elliott County, now known as Rt. 1, Sandy Hook.
