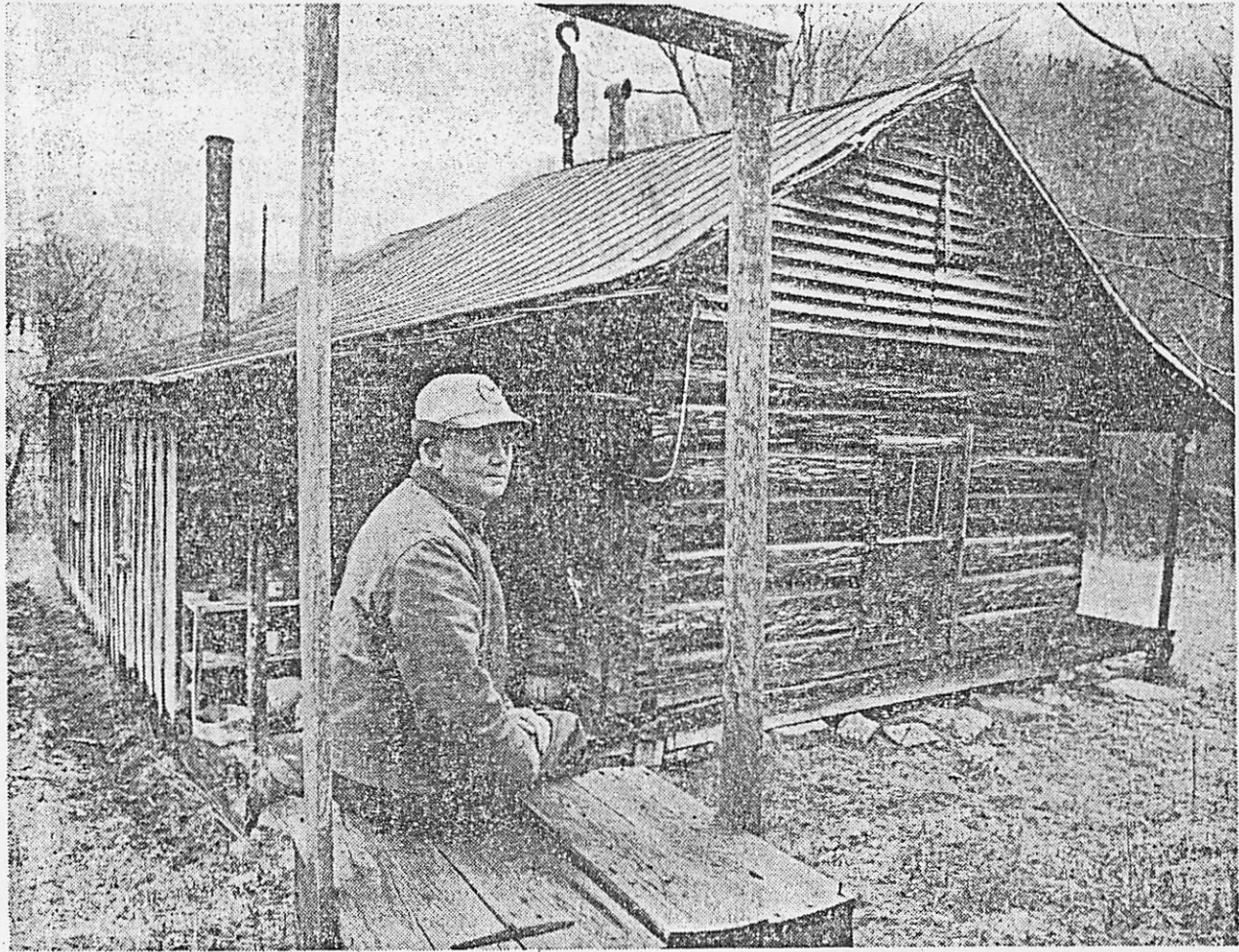

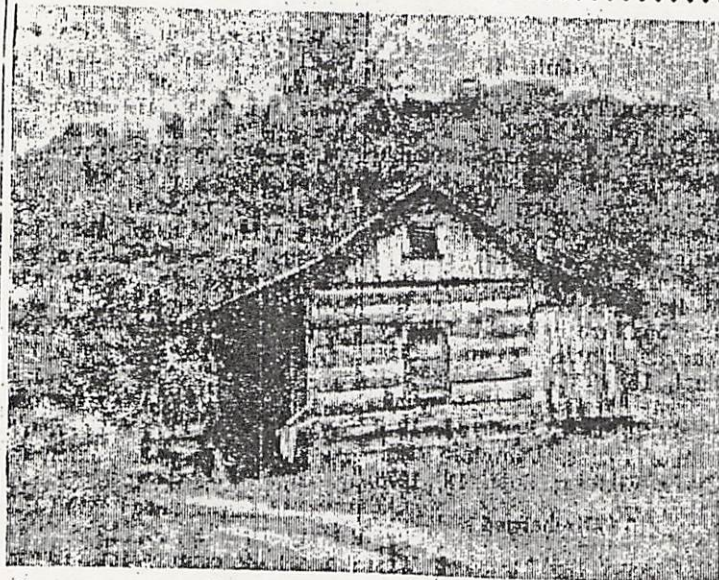

McKenzie Homeplace On Peter Cave Branch in Johnson Co.

CORPS WANTS TO BUY HISTORIC OLD CABIN IN THE PAINT CREEK VALLEY

The Army Corps of Engineers is eagerly trying to buy a historic old log cabin that it let slip through its fingers in the spring of 1975. The cabin, which has been in the McKenzie family since the 1840's was sold separately to a private citizen at the time the Corps of Engineers was trying to buy the property it sits on.

This old house is located on Lower Peter Cave Branch, better known as McKenzie Branch, a tributary of Big Paint Creek, in Johnson County. The stream got its first name from the fact that early settlers gathered here to collect salt peter or petre to make gunpowder. McKenzie Branch got its name from David McKenzie who came from Vir-

ginia in the early 1840's. He built one room about 18 feet square from huge yellow poplar logs. During the Civil War he erected a similar room from yellow pine. It was during this latter construction that a group of Civil War soldiers came along. It can't be verified which side they represented, but they asked David McKenzie why his son, Bud (age 14), was not in the army. McKenzie replied that he was taking no part in the war between the states. The officer replied that he would climb upon the house and get the boy. The old man replied that the first man that reached the top of the ladder would receive a hatchet between his eyes. The soldiers departed in peace.

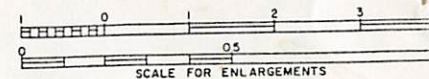
This house has been the residence of five generations of McKenzies. It is in excellent condition considering its age. The top of the chimney has been removed and roofed over. David's son, Lafayette; grandson, William H.; William H.'s son, Forest, and Forest's son, Everett, all lived here. Forest, now deceased, was born here and lived out his 84 years here.

This property lies in the lake area of the proposed Paint Creek Dam. The McKenzie Family reluctantly disposed of this property to the Corps of Engineers. But the Corps let the old house slip through their fingers. Now they want to get the house back.

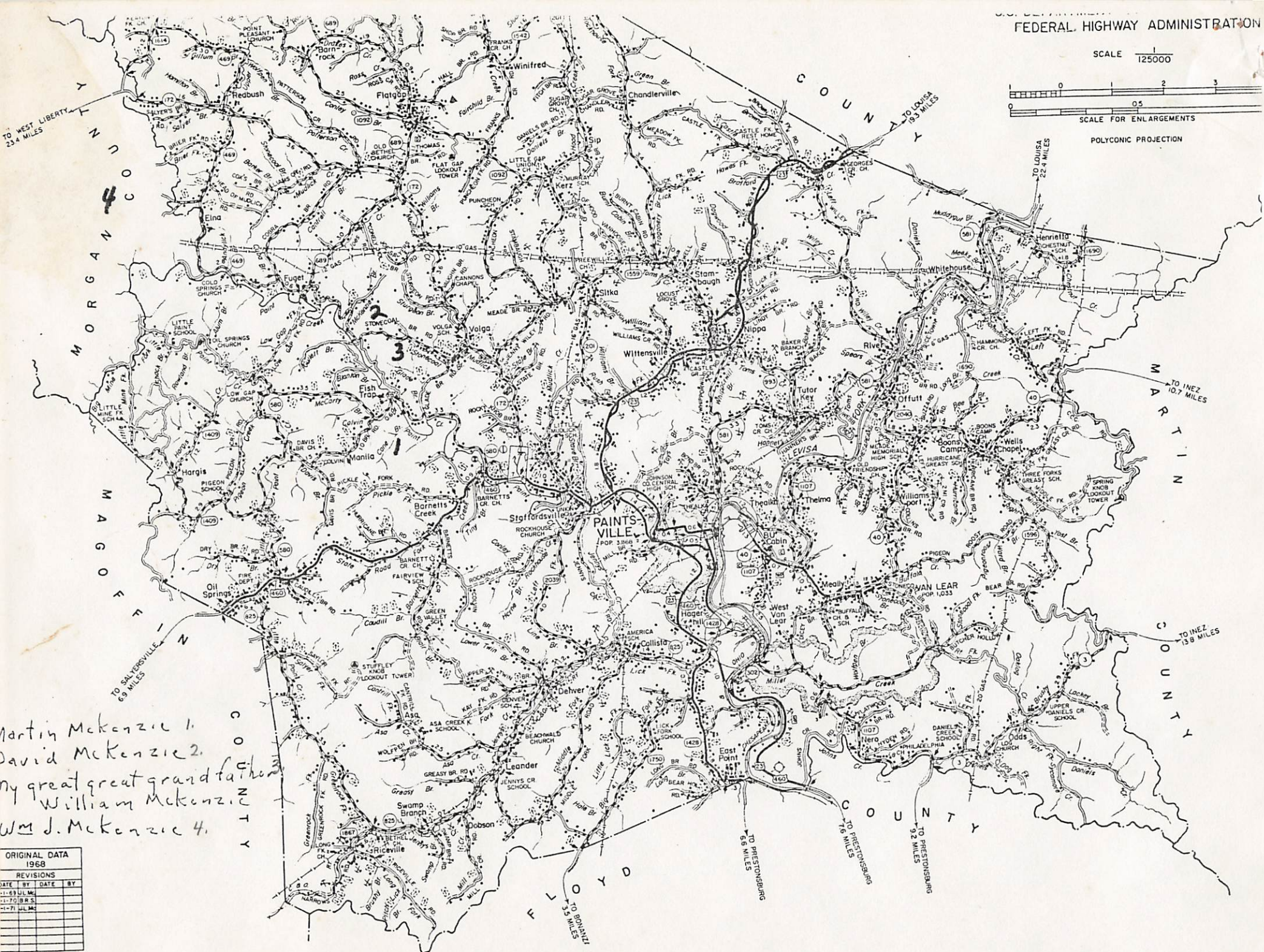
This old landmark had been kept in good condition, roof painted, and lawn well kept until the Corps gained control. Now it, along with many other landmarks, will be wiped out due to the work of the Army Corps of Engineers.

We are trying to save in pictures and on film what Paint Valley was like before it was invaded by the Corps and turned one of the most scenic areas in the state into a land of bridle paths and camp sites where our homes and cemeteries and churches used to be. That is about the only way our descendants will know what they missed before supposed "Progress" wiped out the valley.

John McKenzie of Scott County, Va. was born -2-. He died in 1837. His wife's name is unknown. His children, all born in Scott county were:

Burgess	William	Oliver

DAVID -- is Elige & Henry McKenzie's grandfather.

All of the children, except Burgess and Nancy, moved to Johnson County before 1851.

David McKenzie was born in Scott County, Va. on June 12, 1811. He died on March 10, 1878. David's first marriage was to Cynthia Estep on Sept. 17, 1832. David and Cynthia had a daughter, Martha, who married Andrew Picklesmer, in Johnson County in 1848. Cynthia died before 1836.

David's second marriage was to Anna Saunders on Feb. 21, 1836. Anna was the daughter of Thomas Saunders, a Revolutionary war soldier. David moved to Kentucky about 1844. David and Anna had the following children::

Ollie had two wives. He had ten children by his first wife. He then married Stacy Gipson and they had seven children. One of Ollie's sons, Joe McKenzie, lives in Louisa, Kentucky.

Hood married Lizzie Gipson, a sister of Ollie's wife. They had ten children. Two sons, Jessie and Frank, live in Louisa, Kentucky.

Elige McKenzie, born May 20, 1883 in Floyd County, Kentucky and died July 26, 1961 in Tecumseh, Michigan, had two wives. His first wife, Martha Joseph McKenzie, was born 1871 and died Nov. 16, 1919 in Alger, Ohio. They had nine children. All of the children were born in Kentucky, except Ethel, and she was born in Ohio. Around 1916, Elige moved to McGuffey, Ohio, where he worked as a farmer.

After his first wife died, he married Polly (Pearl) Higgins around 1924 in Ohio. He then moved to Tecumseh, Michigan, where he also was a farmer. In later years he lived in Palmyra, Michigan and Adrian, Mich. Before his retirement, Elige was employed by the Lenawee County Road Commissioner as a truck driver. Elige and his second wife had six children.

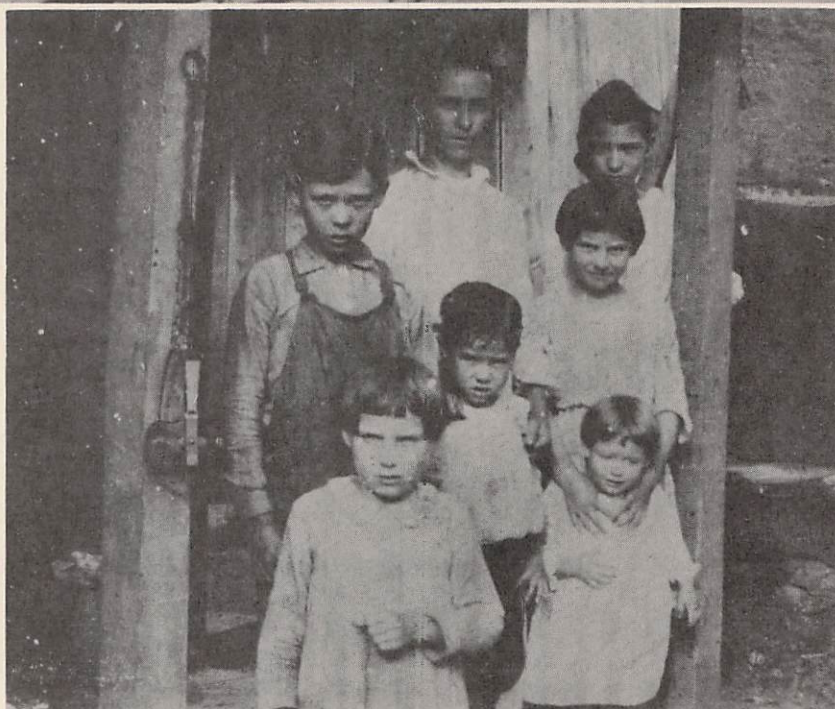

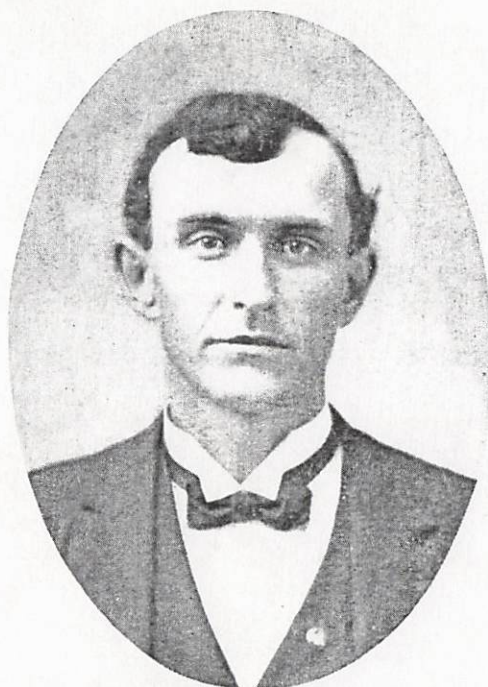

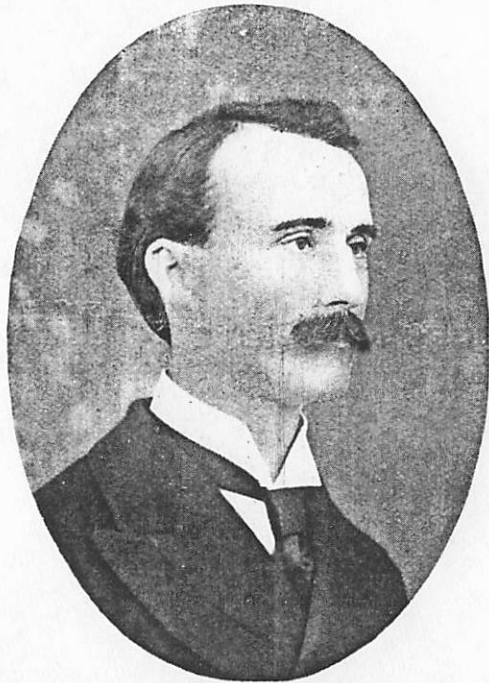

Only one lived to reach the age of 50. The others, killed by the guns of law officers or committing suicide, died in their late 20's or 30's. The earliest birth record of any of them was that of 1866. Some were in the 1870's. All started a career of crime in their late teens and early 20's.

In this story we will try to cover the short lives of these men, Butch Cassidy, the Logan brothers, Sundance Kid, Ben Kilpatrick and a cousin of the Logan brothers, Bob Lee. It will be necessary for us to go back several years before the Logan brothers became residents of Montana in order to bring you up to date with events leading to their becoming rustlers, bank robbers and train holdup men.

There were four brothers, Harvey, Lonny, Johnny and Henry. Henry was the only one who lived a life away from crime and the only one to die in bed.

They were all born in the 70's in Rowan County, Va. When Harvey was 10 years old their father

moved to Missouri and shortly thereafter they were sent to Dodson, Mont., to live with their aunt, a sister of their father. The other boys were younger. After their arrival in Montana their aunt said they displayed signs of restlessness, were always reading Ned Buntline's wild stories of the West and talking with an old pioneer about the early days.

Harvey was 19, Lonny 18 and Johnny 16 when they left their aunt's home in Dodson to become cowboys. Henry stayed with his aunt, but left during the next year to become owner of a small country store.

The three Logan boys were joined by their cousin Bob Lee and proceeded to Wyoming where, within a short time, they joined the Hole in the Wall gang of rustlers led by Flat Nose George Curry. Curry's swagger delighted the Logans and under his patronage they became rustlers on a small scale. Harvey in his admiration for Curry adopted his name and became "Kid Curry."

Small Ranch Purchased by Gang

Sometime after their connection with the Hole in the Wall gang, the Logan brothers together with their cousin Lee drove a herd of stolen cattle to Montana where they bought a small spread, a rundown ranch about five miles east of Landusky. This small ranch was to be the hangout for the rustlers from the Hole in the Wall when they were on the dodge and did not feel safe returning to Wyoming after a holdup.

Not satisfied with the life of a small rancher, they returned to the Hole in the Wall and joined the Red Bush Gang. However, after the death of the leader of the Red Bush Gang, the Logans returned to their ranch in Montana.

Our story really started when on Nov. 3, 1887, Butch Cassidy and the McCarty brothers robbed their first train, the Denver and Rio Grande, near Junction, Colo. This was followed on March 30, 1889, with the robbery of a bank in Denver and three months later the San Miguel Bank of Telluride, Colo.

Butch Cassidy had a good deal to do with the lives of the Logan brothers. Cassidy was supposed

to be the grandson of a Mormon bishop and the son of a Utah rancher. He was not one of the original members of the Hole in the Wall gang. His apprenticeship was gained with the rustling of a few cattle along with the McCarty brothers. He was born Robert Leroy Parker, April 6, 1866, but changed his name to Cassidy after his hero rustler, Mike Cassidy. The "Butch" came after he had worked a short time in Rock Springs, Colo., as a butcher.

At the age of 23 years he was arrested for the first time by a posse and convicted of horse stealing. He spent the next two years in jail. On being returned from prison in 1890 he immediately formed a band of outlaws which included Elsie Lay. Their first job after his return was that of robbing a bank in Montpelier, Vt., which gave them some \$7,000, and on April 21 of the next year they took a mine payroll at Castle Rock, Utah, for \$8,000.

Later on Lay was captured robbing the Colorado and Southern Railroad near Alma, Colo., and sentenced to life imprisonment. Flatnose George was shot and killed soon after.

Curry at Wyo. Train Holdup

June 2, 1899.

Kid Curry was there when the express was blown up in a holdup near Wilcox, Wyo. Cassidy planned the robbery. Along with Butch were George Curry, Harvey Logan and Lay. The train was stopped by putting a red lantern on the track. As the train ground to a halt near a small wooden bridge, two men jumped into the cab and ordered the engineer to uncouple the express car and move the train across the bridge. The engineer refused and Harvey Logan smashed him across the face with his gun barrel. The engineer then moved the train across the bridge, a few minutes before the bridge was destroyed by a dynamite charge set under it.

Cassidy then called to the express messenger to come out. He refused and told them to come in and get him. Cassidy slipped a few sticks of dynamite under the car and touched it off. The messenger was tossed the length of the car and was barely conscious when found by the holdup men. Logan would have killed him, but Cassidy said that a man with his nerve deserves not to be shot.

They blew the safe and being amateurs, blew part of the bonds and currency to the four corners of the car.

Shortly after word reached Cheyenne a posse was sent out from that point and joined later by a posse from Converse County. Sheriff Hazen was in charge.

One of the four men evaded the posse early in the day but Curry, Lay and Logan were trailed and cornered and were forced to make a stand behind some rocks. Here Officer Hazen was killed by a shot from the gun of Kid Curry. The outlaws knew they couldn't escape with their horses and abandoned them there. The posse was camped at the mouth of the canyon and the outlaws decided to try to break out of the canyon. Clouds covered the moon. The outlaws, slithering among the rocks, passed the sentries, shifting the

bags of money from one to the other as they worked their way past the guards. They traveled on foot to the Platte River where they found a rancher friend who supplied them with horses, food and ammunition. Cassidy had escaped earlier during the hunt, but joined up with the remainder of his gang and there they split the money. Curry now left the bunch to journey back to Montana.

After the robbery of the Winnemucca bank in Nevada of \$32,000, Butch knew the outlaw's day had ended and he purchased a ticket for the south. On March 1, 1901, Cassidy, the Sundance Kid and Etta Place boarded a boat for Brazil.

Kid Curry was traced by the bills, but before the detectives caught him he wounded two men and was wounded himself in a pool hall fight in Knoxville, Tenn. That night he spent in the woods and next morning surrendered to the police. On the night after his trial he called a guard to a window near his cell to see the beautiful sunset. The guard looked out and as he turned his back, the Kid slipped a metal noose made from a broom around his neck and tied him to the bars.

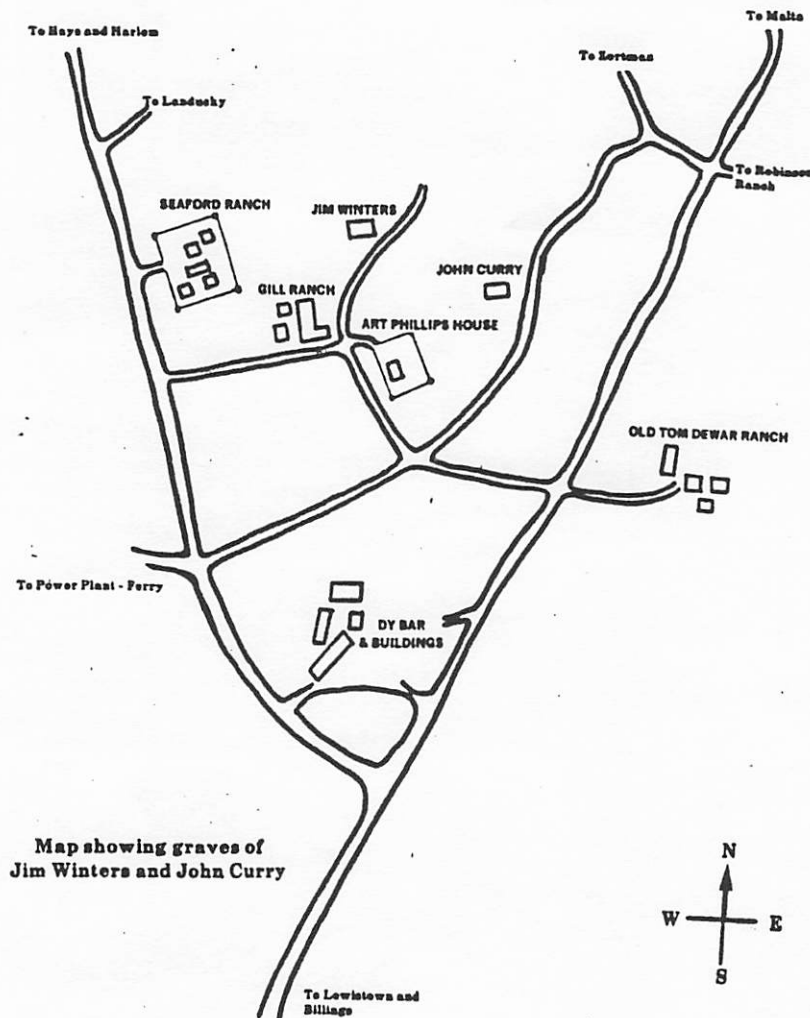
The Kid rode out on the sheriff's horse.

Safely out of the country and ranching peacefully in Brazil under the name of Mr. and Mrs. Harry D. Place and James Ryan were the Sundance Kid, Etta Place and Butch Cassidy.

Ryan and the Sundance Kid stole a mule and on their way back to their ranch stopped in San Vicente, 15 miles from where the mule was stolen. They stopped at an inn which also doubled as a police station and the chief of the soldier-police recognized the mule. A gun battle followed in which the Sundance Kid was killed by rifle fire. Cassidy kept up the fight until his ammunition was about gone. He saved one bullet for himself and as the sun rose in the morning he used it.

Many in Montana did not believe that was the way Cassidy

died. For many years there was a rumor that Cassidy wasn't dead and was roaming his old haunts near Lander, Wyo.

enough and figured he'd sell his spread. He found buyers in the half-brothers and partners, Jim Winters and Abram Gill. The Tressler Ranch became known as the Gill Ranch and is still known as that today.

HOW she ever arrived at the conclusion is difficult to comprehend, but Mrs. Tressler decided she still owned the ranch. After Winters and Gill refused to vacate the place at her bidding, she persuaded Curry to get rid of them.

John Curry sent word to Winters and ordered him off the place by the first of February 1896. If Winters was still on the ranch on that date, Curry said, he would be there to kill Winters.

Winters, knowing that Curry was likely to keep his word, had a loaded rifle in his hands and was waiting on his porch on Feb. 1. On that day, a lone rider appeared some distance off and when he was within rifle range, Winters took careful aim and fired. Curry fell from his saddle — dead at the hands of Jim Winters.

The Curry brothers buried Johnny's

body about a mile to the east and within sight of the Gill ranchhouse. As far as the Currys were concerned, Winters was considered fair game. They vowed to avenge John's death by killing Winters.

DURING the next five years Winters and Gill continued to build the ranch. One wonders how the grave of John Curry, within sight all the time, affected them. There must have been some thought given to the threat the remaining Curry brothers posed. Whatever they may have had to live with, Gill and his half-brother, Jim Winters, refused to run from the Currys.

According to the Harlem, Montana Enterprise of July 26, 1901, Gill appeared in Harlem wishing to send word to the sheriff in Fort Benton that his partner, Winters, had been ambushed at six on the morning of July 25, 1901.

Gill stated that Winters had just stepped onto the porch of their log home when he was struck and killed by a bullet fired by someone in the bushes 50 feet away. Although it was never

proven, it was generally agreed that one of the Currys was the assassin.

Oddly enough, Gill himself vanished upon the sale of his ranch to the Circle C or Coburn outfit in 1916. His disappearance remains a mystery to this day. Old-timers speculate as to Gill's sudden departure and their suspicions center around one Jake Meyers who worked for the Circle C and for B. M. Phillips, the man who bought the Gill Ranch from the Coburns.

Today the Gill Ranch is owned by the Square Butte Grazing Association. Should the old spread ever change hands again, it is a pretty good bet that the grave of Johnny Curry, a mile east of the house, and the grave of Jim Winters, a half mile north, will remain where they are.

They are just two lonely graves within sight of each other.

My name is Lillian Adams, age

If I recall correctly, we moved
to Clearfield, which was then a
small village.

My mother was born Cynthia

Whitt in Morgan County somewhere.
My mother's father was named Meredith
("Merdy") Whitt who owned a small
grocery store in a place called
Pleasant Run. My grandfather
"Merdy" had an older brother
named Milford who married a
Lanta or "Lannie" Lewis. So you
see I'm a great niece of Milford and
maybe related by blood to Lannie.
As I was so young at this
time and since I've never been
back to Morgan County but once
or twice some things are hard
to recall since my mother, now-
deceased, related through the years
these things to me.

If you notice in my long name
you will find the name Nancy. I
was named after a great or great-great
Aunt "Nance" or "Nannie" Lewis on my
father's side. I believe that she was

a widow at that time and she would come to visit us and let my mother & father go into Pleasant Run or Wrigley for supplies. I was so young, but I do remember living at a place called the Gladys Oakley place, when she would come to visit. This Aunt Name of mine may not be the one whose descendants you are seeking, if not it will be a coincidence of two being around at that time. He would have been 40 yrs. old at the time I was born. I was born Jan 12, 1918

I'm definitely related to Aunt Lannie by marriage, and maybe by blood. There are a few other small things I faintly remember that may or may not be helpful to you.

Margaret and Elizabeth McClenzy were taken Captivity by the Indians in ¹⁷⁶⁴ when ~~they~~ the Indians killed their mother, Jemima McClenzy, and their brother, Henry and sister, Sallie, Mary Ann and an infant girl.

Mosedack and Isaac McClenzy were out rounding up stray horses on Lenistock when the Indians attacked.

Margaret and Elizabeth McClenzy remained in Indian Captivity for about 18 years. Mosedack and Isaac kept looking for them, finally finding them ^{returning their home} after the Battle of Fallen Timbers in Lucas County, Ohio on 8-20-1794. They returned to their home in Giles County, Virginia.

Margaret had been transferred by the Shawnee Tribe to the Delaware Tribe & was adopted by Chief Koshumpum.

Elizabeth had remained with the Shawnee Tribe and had been adopted by Chief Peterme.

Elizabeth in ~~Captivity~~ Captivity married an English trader John Clark and had 3 children: John Kenzie Clark and twins William & Sarah Clark. Elizabeth stayed in Captivity until after Wayne's Victory when she was found either by ~~Isaac~~ Isaac or her father Mosedack. After Elizabeth was restored to her home in Va. she married in 1801 Jonas Clegburn, descent of Sect. Wm. Clegburn. Her father was Isaac McClenzy.

They had 2 sons. Archibald & Henry Chyburn-
Elizabeth is buried in an unmarked grave in
Indiana -

Archibald Chyburn, an early Chicago settler
arriving at Fort Dearborn in August 1823. He returned
to Va. in 1824 and returned to Fort Dearborn with
his mother, father, brother Henry and others.

Margaret married Benjamin Hall of Giles Co. Va.
had one son David, they moved from Va.
to Princeton, W. Va. David Hall built ~~at~~
Possibly built the 1st frame house in Mercer Co. W.
