




Will of John Meador, Jr.

Memorandum of the verbal will of John Meador Jr. who deceased May 14, 1720 at his own dwelling house in the county of Essex. In his last sickness he called the deponents to be evidence to this his last will, which is as followeth:

Item; I give to my daughter Susannah Meador all my whole estate, but if my daughter Susannah Meador dye before she comes of age or marries, then I will that my sd. estate be equally divided between William Bourne and Thomas Meador & John Armstrong & William Jordan.

Item; I desire that William Bourne and Thomas Meador be my executors and that they take care of my sd. daughter.

Written May the 17th. in the year above written.

At a court for Essex County on Wed. 18th day of May, 1720, this noncupative will of John Meador was presented in court by Wm. Bourne & Thomas Meador, the will named, who made oath thereto-----being further proved by the oaths of Within named, who made oath thereto------being further proved by the oaths of John Allen, Richard Gregory, and Ann Bradbury, witnesses thereto, is admitted to record.

Will of John Meador (Senior)

In the Name of God, Amen. I, John Meador of Essex County, being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and perfect memory, blessed be God, therefore do make and ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament in the manner and form following:

First and principally, I commend my soul into the hands that giveth, hoping by the meritorious death and passion of my Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, to receive full pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and offences, and a joyful resurrection in the last day; and my body to be decently buried at the direction of my executors hereafter named. And as for my worldly goods:

Item. I give to my son Thomas Meador, one shilling.

Item. I give to my daughter Rachell Jordan, one shilling.

Item. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Armstrong, one shilling.

Item. I give to my daughter Dinah Tribille, one shilling.

Item. My desire is that my five sons shall keep their own guns without appraising.

Item. I give to my daughter Mary Meador, one gold ring.

Item. I give to my son Jonas Meador a small piece of land joining upon Thomas Evinses land and running up to the church road that goes from my house, then up a (long?) road a small course until it comes to a vale that goes to ye branch, so down the branch till it comes to the forks of the branch where it begins, and from the forks to ye first beginning. And the rest of my land I begins, and from the forks to be Equally Divided, with all my houses and give to my other four sons, to be Equally Divided, with all my houses and orchards thereon belonging, and I do appoint my two sons Job Meador and Jason Meador my lawful Executors.

Item. I give to my son Joshua Meador one Chest not to be appraised, and the rest of my estate to be equally divided amongst my children and leave to my youngest Sons to be of age at seventeen and I do leave my son Jonas Meador to look after them three years. And that my will not to be in force till my decease,







Will of Thomas Meador

In the name of God, Amen, I, Thomas Meador of Essex County in the Parrish of South Farnham, being in perfect sence and memory, Praise the Almighty for the same, I do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, Revoking and Disamuling all other Wills heretofore Written, in Manner and form as followeth, to wit:

First and Principally I commend my Soul unto the hands of Almighty God who gave it, hoping through ... the Merrits and Death of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free Pardon of all my Sins and Wickednesses in General and to Inherit Everlasting Life through my Savior Christ, and my Body I commit to the Earth to be decently and Christianly buried, hoping at the Last Day of to the Earth to be decently and Christianly buried, hoping at the Last Day of Judgement it shall be reunited to my soul to a happy Ressurection, and as for Judgement it hath pleased Almighty God to Bless me with, I do give my worldly estate which it hath pleased Almighty God to Bless me with, I do give as followeth:

Item. I give to my son Rubin Meador all the remainder part of my land belong to the Burrying Place lying between the lands I gave to my sons John Meador & Thomas Meador, to him and his Male heirs Lawfully begotten his Body forever, and for want of such heirs then to my son Thomas Meador and his Male heirs Lawfully begotten of his Body forever.

Item. I give to my son Ruben Meador my old hunting gun which was made by Peter Byram & Three good cows & calves & Desire they may not be appraised, being left him instead of money Lond to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Allen, wife of Benjamin Allen, the same feather Bed I lent her at the Day of Marriage to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Rachel Armstrong, wife of Ambrose Armstrong, the same Feather Bed I lent her at the Day of Marriage to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Sarah Meador one Feather Bed with all the furniture &c. to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Easter Meador one feather Bed with all the furniture &c. to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Frances Bell one feather Bed with with all the furniture &c. to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give to Susannah Meador forty five shillings current money to be put to her use During her life, to be paid yearly by my Executors hereafter named.

Item. I desire that all the Remainder part of my Estate of what kind soever being Real & Personal and lying & being in what Place soever be Equally Divided amongst my Nine Children, viz.: John Meador, Thomas Meador, Ambrose Meador, Ruben Meador, Sarah Meador and Easter Meador, Elizabeth Allen, Rachel Armstrong, & Frances Bell, to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I do constitute & Appoint my two sons Thomas Meador & Ruben Meador full, whole & sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, Revoking all other will or wills heretofore by me made, & Acknowledge this my Will & no other ---

In Witness whereof I have hereunto Sett my hand and fixt my Seal this 31st. day of July Anno Domi. 1758.






Jonas Meador was born in Essex County, Virginia and died in Cumberland County, Virginia. The children were born in Essex or Caroline County: The three Holloways were children of John Holloway and Hannah Spiers. James Holland was the son of John Holland and Jane Bond. Sarah Atkinson was the daughter of Samuel Atkinson and wife Mary Ann. Parentage of the others has not been established.

(5) Jesse served in the American Revolution in the Minute Men from Amelia County. (6) Josiah, Jr. served three enlistments totalling 1 year 11 months. Three sons of (5) Joel served together from Bedford County about 6 months apiece; these were (6) Jonas, (6) Isham, and (6) Joel Meador, Jr.

(4) Jason Meador



Jason was born in Essex County, Virginia. He followed family members to Caroline, Amelia, and Bedford Counties in Virginia, before going to South Carolina in 1760 with the Moberlys. The five marriages shown were all to children of Edward Moberly and Susannah DeRuel; Edward was a son of William Moberly and Phoebe Lovejoy, who lived in Portobago, Maryland. Jason Jr., Job and Thomas Huntley all served in the Revolutionary War.
