MEEK FAMILY OF LAWRENCE COUNTY

The Meek family is of Scotch-Irish descent. In 1765 a number of Meek families emigrated from Ulster (Northern) Ireland, landing at Charleston, South Carolina. With these families came other families including Andrew Jackson, Sr. and his wife Elizabeth (Hutchison) Jackson, parents of President Andrew Jackson, both of Scotch-Irish descent.

Reputable historians have stated that Adam Meek was a soldier of the American Revolution, serving in Captain Baker's Company under Colonel Francis Marion of South Carolina. The records show that Moses Meek had service in the Revolutionary War as a private in Captain William Alexander's Troop in the Regiment of Light Dragoons commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel Wade Hampton of South Carolina.

The U.S. Census of South Carolina for 1790 bears the names of Captain Adam Meek, James Meek, Sr., James Meek, Jr., John Meek, Thomas Meek, Athi Meeks, Jesse Meeks and Littleton Meeks.

According to family tradition James Meek and his brother William migrated from North Carolina to the Big Sandy Valley about 1800 and settled in the vicinity of the present-day Offutt, Johnson county.

- 23. Rev. Zephaniah Meek, D.D., distinguished minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and publisher, was b. in Johnson county in 1833. Having in his boyhood days but few opportunities to procure an education, he used these the best he could, and supplemented the lack of high-schools and academies by reading and studying the best books obtainable by loan or purchase. By systematic study, consecutively pursued, he was at thirty superior in knowledge and mental culture to almost any of his age in his native county. In early life he taught school, like most men who have come to prominence; acted as county and circuit court clerk for Johnson county and for some years engaged in mercantile business and speculated in oil and made considerable money; removed to Catlettsburg, Boyd county, in 1865 and made investments there; established, in the Spring of 1867, edited and published at Catlettsburg the Christian Observer, subsequently called the Central Methodist, a sixteen-page paper, as the organ of his Church; published for the author, William Ely, history of the "Big Sandy Valley", 1887.

Rev. Meek received the degree of D.D. from the Kentucky Military Institute, Farmdale, Kentucky, in 1885. He m., in Johnson County, *November*, 18, 1854, Mary Jane Davis.

Becoming interested in coal mining, he opened up and operated for a number of years a coal mine at the mouth of Greasy Creek, Johnson county, and later acquired and operated some coal mines on Beaver Creek, Floyd county.

Mr. Meek served as mayor of Paintsville, was active in politics

for some time and was a leader of the Democratic party.
